Plenty to do in The City on JUNE 15

On June 15, residents can choose from two great free events in the City. In the morning, the Westlake Village Library is hosting the 5th annual **Chalk Walk**. That night, enjoy the "King" as Raymond Michael performs all the classic **Elvis Presley** songs at the "Saturdays in the Park" concert series kick-off. Both programs are free to attend, open to the public, and enjoyable for all ages.

Inspired by the **Chalk Walk** that originated in Santa Barbara several years ago, the Westlake Village Library Chalk Walk celebrates families where everyone can create, display, and view art together in the courtyard of the Civic Center. To obtain a space for their artwork, participants may register ahead of time with the Library. The Library provides the chalk and space, while the participants provide the creativity and artwork. The event runs from 9:00 am - 2:00 pm and is open to residents of all ages to either participate or attend. At the end of the day, art professionals will judge the contest and award a prize to the best family, child, teen, and adult space. This event kicks off the summer reading program for the Westlake Village Library. To register, please call the Library at 818-865-9230.



The fun continues into the evening with an "**Elvis Tribute featuring Raymond Michael**" concert in the park. The event is the first of three summer concerts held at Berniece Bennett Park located at 31800 Village Center Road. "Saturdays in the Park" begins at 7:00 pm. Food will be available for purchase from Rock Chef Rolls, a gourmet food truck, beginning at 6:00 pm. These outdoor performances are free to the public and families are encouraged to attend. Please bring lawn chairs and picnic baskets for a delightful early evening summer performance. As the temperatures drop in the early evening hours, it is helpful to bring warmer attire for the evening to best enjoy the entertainment. Several months ago, the City began producing and airing a monthly video newsletter. The monthly program features information on upcoming City events, programs, and projects. Additional features have included sidewalk CPR, the City's upcoming Lindero overpass improvement project featuring a new mural, and White Oak Elementary School's Ellis Island Program. Recently, the video newsletter incorporated a new segment, "Westlake Village Originals" which features a one-on-one interview with residents or individuals who have been involved in the City long before incorporation in 1981. This month, "Westlake Village Originals" features Mr. John Notter who played a significant role for American Hawaiian Steamship Company in the development of the Westlake Village area in the 1960's and 70's. 


Public City Website Safety Corner

Alert Center

When public safety related incidents occur such as road closures or fires residents can turn to the City website to receive up-to-date information. During these types of incidents, City Hall will be in close contact with public safety officials about any potential impacts to the City. In addition, City staff will use the "Alert Center" on the City website to provide information on these events to City residents.

The website "Alert Center" provides up-to-date information on incidents occurring in or impacting the City. This information is posted on the City website, www.wlv.org and also sent out via email or text message to those residents who have signed up to receive messages. The "Alert Center" is not the same as the City's reverse 911 program, Connect-CTY. Connect-CTY allows the City to phone every registered phone number within the City in the event of a life threatening emergency or major event. In contrast, the website "Alert Center" requires interested residents to sign-up to receive messages and is used more often.
