## Lindero Canyon Road /101 Freeway Bridge Reconstruction to Begin in September

On July 10, the City Council approved an agreement with LA Engineering to begin construction on the Lindero Canyon/101 Freeway bridge. Work on the bridge is scheduled to begin in mid-September. In addition to sending notification letters to residents and businesses near the project, the City will be placing electronic message board signs near the construction location prior to work commencing. Up-to-date information and notifications on the project status and unforeseen traffic delays will be available for easy access via the City website. (Please see sidebar on information regarding this service.)

It is anticipated that construction will be performed in three different phases. All construction work will take place behind temporary concrete barriers for the safety of both the public and construction workers. It is anticipated that one lane of travel in each direction will remain open throughout construction. A safe pedestrian route will also be available on one side of the bridge, and pedestrians should look for signage to guide them during each of the three phases.


When this project is completed, the Lindero Canyon Road/101 bridge will have an additional lane in each direction of traffic. Aesthetic improvements will include stone applications to the interior of the bridge and an eleven-foot-wide lit pedestrian walkway on the east side. While the walkway will be constructed in concrete, it will feature a wooden plank effect imprinted into the concrete. Finally, each corner of the bridge will be defined with a stone pilaster that will display a bronze sailboat similar to the City entry monuments. However, the most dramatic change will be a 300-foot-long sculpture on the exterior of both sides of the bridge. This mural was created by internationally known artist, Joe Wertheimer, in his Westlake Village studio. It will feature an iconic scene of the City with the lake, surrounding hillsides, and the City's name prominently featured in the mural. As the main entry into the City, the newly designed Lindero Canyon/101 bridge will serve as an appropriate gateway to the "City in the Country" for years to come.

# Registration for the Senior Recreation Program



For several years, the City has contracted with the Conejo Recreation and Park District to offer senior recreation classes at the Westlake Village Civic Center. The popular program offers exercise, bridge, and computer classes. Class fees for senior residents (55 and over) are \$5. Non-residents or non-seniors are asked to pay between \$35 and \$50 per class. Most classes are eight-weeks in length with the exception of the technology classes (3-4 weeks.)

# School is Starting –

## Remember to Take Extra Caution out on the Road

As the beginning of another school year approaches, the City of Westlake Village would like to remind drivers to use extra caution when out on the road, especially in the areas around Westlake Village Transit vehicles, crosswalks, and White Oak Elementary School. Access, circulation, and parking at White Oak Elementary School works well as long as everyone understands the system and complies with local traffic signs and markings. Parents with children who attend White Oak Elementary are asked to familiarize themselves with the drop-off areas, turn restrictions, crosswalk areas, and general traffic flow prior to the start of school on August 21. Also, remember that the drop-off areas tend to be particularly busy during the first week or two of school, so try to arrive a little early (supervision for early drop-off is paid for by the City and is provided in the courtyard beginning at 7:45 am).

Over the years, the City Council's Public Safety Committee, City staff and school officials have met to review and update the morning drop-off procedures at White Oak Elementary. Please take a moment to go over the traffic safety suggestions below:

- ✧ Observe the red zones and parking restriction signs. These restrictions have been established to improve visibility, reduce conflicts, and provide other safety benefits.
- ✧ Note there is a red zone on the street in front of the Faculty parking lot. This is intended to improve safety by reducing the pedestrian traffic through the parking lot. Parents walking their children to school from the east should use the walkway on the east side of the parking lot – this walkway goes around the parking lot, thereby providing a path that avoids conflicts with moving cars in the lot.
- ✧ The Faculty parking lot is to be used for kindergarten drop-offs only (no parking, even for a few minutes). Other students may be dropped off in the drive-through in front of the multi-purpose room (MPR) or across the street from the kindergarten drop-off area.
- ✧ Try to plan your route so it is unnecessary to make left turns in the vicinity of the school zone. In addition to improving overall safety, this will reduce the delay experienced by you and other parents.
- ✧ Note that the drop-off area by the multi-purpose building is one-way so that the students can be safely dropped off directly next to the walkway. City-sponsored Traffic Aides will assist your child in/out of your vehicle during the morning and afternoon peak periods. When using the drop-off area, pull forward as far as possible to permit the most effective use of this area. This is one of the most important contributions you can make to reduce congestion and overall delay.
- ✧ There is no stopping or drop-off next to the frontage road median. Traffic arriving from the west may access the parking lot drop-off areas or use the curbside drop-off area east of Shropshire Court.

## Westlake Village Transit Bus Pass Sales Have Begun



Residents will once again have the option to avoid traffic delays associated with drop-off/pick-up at White Oak Elementary, St. Judes, Lindero Canyon Middle, and Agoura High Schools by utilizing the Westlake Village Transit service. This City-subsidized program offers stops in all major neighborhoods and the three public schools that serve Westlake Village residents.

An annual round-trip bus pass costs \$238 and a one-way (morning or afternoon) pass is \$158. Bus passes can be purchased in one of three ways: (1) online via the City website and the pass will be mailed; (2) mail-in, forms can be downloaded from the City website (mail-in ends on August 16); or (3) in person at City Hall. Residents may also ride one-way without a bus pass for \$2.00.
