The City offers a variety of programs specifically designed for its senior residents. These programs include five sessions of the senior adult recreation program, Dial-A-Ride transportation service, and special lectures provided by Senior Concerns.

Senior Recreation

Have you ever wanted to learn to draw? Do you have a new I-Phone or I-Pad that you would like to learn how to use? Do you like to dance and exercise? The popular Westlake Village Senior Adult Recreation Program fall session features 22 classes to choose from including a drawing class, I-pad/I-Phone/Smart Phone classes, and a ballroom line dancing class. Additional classes offered include yoga, senior fitness, T'ai Chi, Zumba Gold, bridge, digital camera, and internet skills. These classes are offered through an agreement with the Conejo Recreation and Park District. Westlake Village residents over the age of 55 can register for \$5 per class. 
Senior and Disabled Dial-A-Ride

The City offers a Senior and Disabled Dial-A-Ride program to Westlake Village residents providing rides to locations within Thousand Oaks and Westlake Village. Dial-A-Ride also provides limited service to medical or employment related trips in Agoura Hills. To qualify for the Senior-Dial-A-Ride service, residents must be 65 years of age or older and obtain a free dial-a-ride card from City Hall. The City offers the program through a contract agreement with the City of Thousand Oaks with service 7 days a week. 2014 Grants Offered

for Community and Cultural Organizations

The City is now accepting applications for the 2014 Community Service Grant Program. The City recognizes the value of local organizations that provide specialized social services and cultural programs benefitting our citizens. A total of \$100,000 is earmarked for this year's Community Services Grant Program, and of this amount, \$40,000 has been set aside to support public schools. Grants will be awarded in minimum amounts of not less than \$250. Not-for-profit organizations that serve the residents of the greater City of Westlake Village community are eligible to apply.

Applications are available at City Hall and must be submitted by Friday, January 31, 2014 at 5:00 pm. Proposals will be evaluated by a review committee and grants will be awarded by the City Council on a competitive basis. Three Ways to Watch Westlake Village Channel 10

Programming on Westlake Village Channel 10 continues to grow. Residents who tune in can see the Westlake Village Video Newsletter, live and replayed City Council meetings, and programming supplied by the County of Los Angeles. Westlake Village programming can be viewed in one of three ways.

Time Warner Cable



If your household subscribes to Time Warner Cable, Westlake Village programming is still available on Channel 10; however, Time Warner recently converted Channel 10 to a digital format. This change requires a digital cable box from Time Warner to continue to view Channel 10. While most homes already have some form of digital cable box, typically a DVR, some residents who are still accessing their cable directly from the wall without any form of cable box will no longer be able to receive Channel 10. To continue access to City programming, residents must request a digital adaptor directly from Time Warner. This device is provided free through January 2015. After that date, subscribers will be charged \$.99 per month for each adaptor they use. Please note that some newer televisions can be programmed to receive Westlake Village programming without a cable box. AT&T U-verse



AT&T recently added Westlake Village programming to their U-verse lineup which can be accessed via channel 99. Residents can select Westlake Village from the menu of local government options. Once selected, Westlake Village will continue to be the featured option on channel 99.

Public Safety Corner

Basic Emergency Technology Preparedness Checklist

- ☞ Invest in an extra power source for your cell phone. This can be a car charger, solar-powered charger or back-up battery. Keep the power source in your emergency kit.
- ☞ Program an "ICE" (In Case of Emergency) contact into your cell phone. Choose a relative or someone who lives nearby and inform them that they are your emergency contact. If you are in an accident, emergency personnel can check your ICE listing to reach them.
- ☞ Know how to send text message updates. After a disaster, it is often easier to send a text message than to make a voice call. Enable text messaging on your device so you can contact family and friends if the cell network is congested. However, remember that if you have an emergency you need to CALL 911.
- ☞ Purchase a battery-powered or hand-cranked radio. Keep the radio and extra batteries in your emergency kit so you can get valuable information after a disaster.
- ☞ Store important documents on a secure flash drive to keep in your emergency kit. Save copies of important documents such as financial records, insurance, identification photos, pet records, and banking information onto a flash drive. Keep this flash drive in your emergency kit so it is readily available after a disaster.
- ☞ Sign up for the City of Westlake Village mass communication system. To sign-up for life threatening emergency phone alerts, visit the City website at www.wlv.org and click on Connect-CTY. City landline phones are already uploaded into the system, but you can add your mobile phone. Additionally, sign-up to receive email and text message alerts for non-life threatening emergency situations through the City website, click on "Notify Me" and then select "Alert Center."
- ☞ Take pictures or video of ALL of your belongings in every room of your home. Store the pictures on your emergency flash drive and in an alternate location. These will be required should you need to make an insurance claim.
