Proposed Housing Element Update for 2014

On February 12, 2014, the City Council will hold a public hearing to review a proposed update to the City's General Plan Housing Element. The Housing Element is a state required document that reflects the City's goals and policies with regard to housing. The proposed update will incorporate relatively minor changes with regard to the City's housing policy and identify potential locations for future residential development within the City. As the future public hearing process for the draft Business Park Specific Plan may include the discussions regarding these potential locations, the Housing Element will likely be updated again to reflect the final decision of the City Council once the Specific Plan is complete.

The public hearing will be held at 6:30 pm in the City Council chambers at 31200 Oak Crest Drive. All members of the public are invited to attend and comment on this project. Any questions may be directed to Scott Wolfe, Planning Director, at 818-706-1613, or by email at Scott@wlv.org.

CityCare Service Turns 5!

Since its launch in April of 2009, the City of Westlake Village's CityCare program has provided residents the opportunity to report any maintenance or service concerns 24 hours a day/7 days a week to the City. CityCare asks residents to assist City staff by being the "eyes and ears of the community." Examples of items residents may report using the CityCare program include broken sprinklers on public property, street light outages, street repairs, and graffiti. In 2013, the City received and responded to over 200 requests.

Making a CityCare request is as easy as calling, browsing, or clicking. Residents can call City Hall at 818-706-1613 to make a report. After-hours phone calls will be taken by an answering service and routed to the appropriate staff member. CityCare can also be accessed via the City website, www.wlv.org. Residents on-the-go can use the CityCare app on their I-phone or Android device. The app can be found by clicking on the CityCare emblem on the City website.

FIREPLACE SAFETY

While most homes in Westlake Village have a fireplace, many of the newer homes have a "gas" only fireplace. Also known as a zero clearance fireplace, gas burning fireplaces provide less emissions to the environment and are more energy efficient. However, they are only designed to burn gas and not wood, paper, leaves, etc. Placing any item into a gas burning fireplace may cause excessive heat build-up and could potentially lead to a fire. Residents are encouraged to contact the Southern California Gas Company to request a free appliance safety inspection of their fireplace to ensure that it is operating safely. The Gas Company can be reached at 1-800-427-2200.

Additional fireplace safety tips include:

- Homes that have chimneys should be cleaned annually to help prevent unsafe residue from building up.
- Always check the flue to make sure it is open before lighting a fire. This prevents smoke from filling a home.
- Fireplaces should have a glass or metal screen door closed when the fire is burning to protect the home, pets, and people from potential sparks and heat.
- Never leave a fireplace unattended.



Transportation Options Throughout the City of Westlake Village and Surrounding Areas

The LA Metro 161 bus service runs between the City of Thousand Oaks Transportation Center on Rancho Road and the Warner Center Transportation Hub multiple times per day. Once riders reach either transportation center, additional transportation opportunities such as the Metro Orange Bus across the San Fernando Valley, light rail throughout Los Angeles, and buses to all areas of Ventura County including the Amtrak station in Moorpark, are available. With stops in the cities of Agoura Hills, Calabasas, and Thousand Oaks, the Metro 161 creates an easily accessible shuttle throughout the Conejo Valley and beyond.

Riding the Metro 161 is easy. There are several stops along Lindero Canyon Road and Thousand Oaks Boulevard. One-way bus fare is \$1.50. Metro offers discount rides for seniors, disabled, and students. Additionally, Metro's TAP card lets riders pre-purchase their bus fare in weekly or monthly segments at a discounted rate through their website. These fares are then loaded onto the TAP card which can be used to ride any Metro bus or rail line. For more information on the LA Metro 161 or any Metro route, visit www.metro.net.

Did you know that TO Transit, the City of Thousand Oaks Bus Service, stops in the City of Westlake Village?

The TO Transit Blue Line stops daily at Lakeview Canyon and Agoura Road. The route connects to the Thousand Oaks Transportation Center. Fare is \$1.50 each way. Westlake Village Dial-A-Ride card holders ride for free.



Free Cert Training to be Held Beginning March 4th

Los Angeles County Fire Department offers free Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) to residents several times a year. The 7-week class provides training in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. The upcoming CERT class modules will begin on March 4th in Agoura Hills. The classes will meet from 6:30 pm to 9:00 pm in the Agoura Hills Civic Center Community Room located at 30001 Ladyface Court.

CERT graduates are encouraged to join the Westlake Village Disaster Response Team (WLVDRT). The WLVDRT is a volunteer group that provides community members with basic training designed to help them better care for themselves, their families and others in the community in the event of a disaster. Additionally, the WLVDRT recruits, equips, and maintains a well-trained citizen response team to aid the City in the event of an emergency. Members of the WLVDRT will be at a CERT training to provide more information on the Westlake Village team.
