46th Annual 4th of July Parade

Would you like to be part of a hometown tradition during the morning hours of July 4th? Residents of all ages are invited to participate in the 46th Annual Westlake Village 4th of July Parade. A full morning of activities is planned beginning with Boy Scout Troop #752's pancake breakfast located at the former hospital property at 4415 Lakeview Canyon at 8:00 am. Breakfast tickets are available for purchase for \$5 per person or \$20 per family on the day of the event or by calling John Barrus at 805-300-5890. The parade will begin at the same location at 9:45 am. The parade follows a short four-block route to Berniece Bennett Park. There are many ways to enjoy the

parade. Decorate a bike, scooter, stroller, or wagon in patriotic themes or simply line the parade route and cheer on the participants. All veterans are encouraged to join in the parade.

Following the Parade, Boy Scout Troop #485 will perform a U.S. Flag Retirement Ceremony at the park. After the ceremony, the fun continues with inflatable activities, crafts, music, old fashioned park games, free popsicles and water. The Rotary Club of Westlake Village will be selling hot dogs for \$1. The event ends at 12 noon. Parking will be valet only in the Westlake Village Inn lot, but additional parking is available at alternative locations such as the former hospital property. Village Trolley

is Rolling Back into Town through Labor Day Weekend

The "Village Trolley" returns for the summer providing free transportation between Westlake Village neighborhoods, retail areas, and restaurants. The trolley, which began on May 22, will operate on Friday and Saturday nights from 3:00 to 10:00 pm through September 5.

Riding the "Village Trolley" is easy. Simply hop on at one of fifteen stops listed below and hop off whenever you want. The trolley is outfitted with a GPS locator device allowing riders to use their smartphone to track the trolley's progress. The trolley is not just transportation. Every night from 5:00 to 7:00 pm, the City will provide free entertainment on the trolley to make your ride that much more enjoyable. If you are interested in performing on the trolley, please contact Brienne Anderson, Community Services Coordinator. Check the City's website for the up-to-date entertainment schedule. The "Village Trolley" is the perfect way to get to TGIF at the Civic Center and Saturday Concerts in the Park. A special Berniece Bennett Park pick-up/drop-off will be offered on June 13, July 18, and August 22 to coincide with those Saturday concerts.

Community Workshop Regarding California Drought and Water Restrictions

The City of Westlake Village and the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District (LVMWD) will present a community workshop on Wednesday, June 3 at 7:00 pm. The meeting will take place in the City Council Chambers. Representatives from the LVMWD will present information on the newest water rate schedule, water reducing measures for the home, and drought tolerant landscaping options. Included in the discussion will be a presentation by City staff on water reduction measures the City has already implemented along with future efforts. In addition, there will be information available for residents to take home with them. The event is free to attend and will feature a Q & A at the end of the presentations. For those unable to attend, the meeting will be shown live on WLTV (channel 10 on Time Warner Cable and channel 99 on AT&T Uverse) or via live stream on the City's website. Public Safety Corner Slow Down at All Crosswalks



The City and the Lost Hills Sheriff's Station would like to remind all motorists to drive with caution when approaching a crosswalk. The California Vehicle Code requires drivers to yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing in a marked or unmarked crosswalk (with few exceptions, crosswalks exist at every intersection, whether they are marked or not).

Pedestrians, too, should exercise care when crossing at either a marked or unmarked crosswalk. Pedestrians often feel "safer" while in a marked crosswalk and take their eyes off the road which is not a good idea! Before stepping into the street, pedestrians should stop, look for approaching vehicles, try to make eye contact with the drivers, and not begin to cross until convinced any approaching motorist can see him/her and is stopping.

The City provides crossing guards at several intersections before and after school to assist students and families walking to and from school. Motorists and cyclists should also be aware of their legal responsibility regarding crossing guards: the California Vehicle Code requires everyone to obey a crossing guard while the guard is helping someone cross a street or returning to a place of safety. That means the driver must stop and wait, not just until the crossing guard gets to the other side of the street, but until he/she gets all the way back to the corner. It also means pedestrians must wait until the crossing guard instructs them to cross.

Pedestrians, motorists, and cyclists should always travel with caution, especially in and around crosswalks. A little bit of judgment and patience can go a long way to ensure the continued safety of all residents.
