The First Phase of the New Westlake Village Community Park is

NOW OPEN



With its panoramic views, top-notch athletic fields, challenging skateboard park, and fitness trail, the Westlake Village Community Park offers something for residents of all ages. The City of Westlake Village is pleased to announce that Phase 1 of the new Community Park is now open to the public. As of July 1, the Park hours are from 7:00 am until 9:00 pm., with the skate park open from 7:00 am until dusk.

The Community Park currently offers two lighted synthetic turf baseball/softball fields with an overlay soccer field, the first segment of the walking/jogging trail, an outdoor basketball court, volleyball court, skateboard park, restroom and concession facility, and picnic facilities.

As active construction on the next phase of construction begins this fall, park participants are kindly reminded to be alert to construction vehicles and prohibited areas currently under construction. Phase 2 improvements will involve the development of the west end improvements that include three lighted synthetic turf soccer fields, restroom and concession stand, gazebo, and a tot lot area to be constructed on the west end of the park.

Westlake Village Transit Bus Pass Sales Begin on July 27

Residents will once again have the option to avoid traffic delays associated with drop-off/pick-up at White Oak Elementary, Lindero Canyon Middle, and Agoura High Schools by utilizing the Westlake Village Transit service. This City-subsidized program offers stops in all major neighborhoods and the three public schools that serve Westlake Village residents.

An annual round-trip bus pass can be purchased for \$238 and a one-way (morning or afternoon) pass is \$158. Bus passes can be purchased beginning on July 27 in one of three ways: (1) online via the City website and the pass will be mailed to your home; (2) mail-in, forms can be downloaded from the City website (mail-in ends on August 12); or (3) in person at City Hall. Residents may also ride one-way without a bus pass for \$2.00. The first day of school is on Wednesday, August 19, 2015. Additional information including bus routes, registration forms, and signing up for bus alert notifications can be found on the City website, www.wlv.org by clicking on the WVTransit icon on the left hand side.

Residents may also report incidents using the City's website via the CityCare page.



Have You Ridden The "Village Trolley"?



The City's "Village Trolley" program operates a free transportation service between Westlake Village neighborhoods, retail areas, and restaurants operating on Friday and Saturday nights from 3:00 pm - 10:00 pm.

Riding the "Village Trolley" is easy. Simply hop on at one of sixteen stops and hop off whenever you want. On-board entertainment featuring various musicians is scheduled each night from 5:00 pm - 7:00 pm. A special Berniece Bennett Park pick-up/drop-off will be offered on July 18 and August 22 to coincide with the "Concerts in the Park" on those evenings.

Westlake Village Offers Great Opportunities for Walking, Running, and Biking

Whether it is early morning, lunchtime or the weekend, Westlake Village streets and sidewalks are always full of people walking, running, or biking. Thanks to its beautiful landscaping, wide sidewalks, and cooler temperatures, Westlake Village is an inviting place for outside exercise. In fact, the City is home to several annual running, walking and biking events throughout the year.

The safety of pedestrians, joggers, cyclists, and motorists on City streets is of the highest importance to everyone. Toward that end, the City has developed a pedestrian and bike safety brochure that includes preferred walking and cycling routes along with safety tips.

There are some basic walking/running safety tips that all residents should adhere to: (1) wherever possible, walk or run on a sidewalk; (2) if there is not a sidewalk available, please walk or jog facing traffic; and (3) if walking or running at night, wear reflective or light colored clothing. Cyclists can also follow some basic safety precautions as well: (1) cyclists should always wear a helmet; (2) cyclists should always ride in the same direction as traffic; and (3) cyclists should stop at all stop signs and traffic signals. These basic tips are just a few simple suggestions that residents of all ages can use when exercising in Westlake Village.
