The 13th annual Westlake Village City Celebration returns on Saturday, October 17. The fun begins at 3:00 pm and continues until 8:00 pm. The afternoon and early evening event brings together community groups and organizations for a family friendly community gathering held at the Westlake Village Civic Center. With so many things to do, how can you miss it?

White Oak Family Festival

The popular White Oak Family Festival returns with exciting rides like Rat Race, Tornado, Swings, and a Giant Slide. Grab a spot in the circle for the cake walk, choose from treats at the 5th grade bake sale, browse and bid on silent auction items that benefit the White Oak PFC, or try your hand at one of the old fashioned carnival games.

Triunfo YMCA Goblin Gallop 1M, 5K, and 10K

City of Westlake Village Video Newsletter Honored

The City of Westlake Village's Video Newsletter was recently honored at the annual National Association of Telecommunications Officers and Advisors (NATOA) conference in San Diego. The City took home a first place award in the "Community Event Coverage" category with its coverage of the Amgen Tour of California professional cycling race. In addition, the City won first place in the "Magazine Format Series" category where the Westlake Village Video Newsletter bested cities such as Tucson, Arizona and Walnut Creek, California. Finally, the re-occurring Westlake Village "Originals" series received third place recognition.



The Westlake Village Video Newsletter debuted in 2013 in an effort to supplement the wide variety of methods used by the City to communicate with residents. Produced monthly in conjunction with the City's Video consultant, GovTV, the Video Newsletter is shown daily on WLTV (Channel 10 for TWC customers and Channel 99 for AT&T U-verse). Complete episodes can also be downloaded from the City's website, www.wlv.org/videonewsletter. The Video Newsletter features a variety of segments including interviews with City staff on important City projects, safety tips, and City event coverage. In addition, the City produces semi-regular segments such as Westlake Village "Originals" which profiles long-time community members who have made an impact on the City, and Westlake Village "Cooks and Eats", a new cooking show featuring residents sharing some of their favorite family recipes.

Are You Prepared for this Year's Predicted El Nino Weather?



The El Nino weather phenomenon can result in heavy and intense rainfall during the winter and spring months. As this winter follows one of California's driest years, the chances of flooding, mudslides, and potential property damage greatly increase. The Los Angeles County Fire Department reminds local residents to be aware of the potential mud and debris flow dangers associated with rainy days.

All residents should consider the following in preparation for the rainy season:

- Remove debris and leaves in your roof gutters and yard drains. If you live on a hill, clear all swales to ensure that water flows through them properly. Also, check to make sure your yard drains are cleared to prevent ponding.
- Investigate flood or water damage insurance on your homeowner policies.
- Do not attempt to drive through flooded roadways.
- Stay clear of any downed power lines. Call 911 immediately.
- Ensure that your windshield wipers are working properly.
- Sand and sandbags are available at your local Los Angeles County Fire Station #144.

City Council to Consider a Proposed Broadband Enhancement Study

For several years, the City Council's Technology Committee has focused on improving the City's technology infrastructure in an effort to enhance access and use of technology by residents and businesses. Toward that end, the City recently completed a technology strategic plan which identified the enhancement of broadband within the City as the number one priority among both residents and businesses.



At the September 21 City Council Study Session, staff presented a recommendation from the Technology Committee to approve an agreement with Broadband Asset Strategies for the completion of a Citywide Broadband Enhancement Study. The proposed agreement is scheduled for further discussion and potential approval at the October 14 regular meeting of the City Council. If approved, it is anticipated that the study will provide a roadmap for the City to consider on a variety of strategies to enhance and improve broadband delivery to both residents and businesses. In addition, the project will clearly identify multiple options and potential costs for the City Council to consider.

House Number Painting

Clear and visible house numbers on your curb serve an important role in letting visitors and/or emergency responders easily find your house. With that in mind, the City periodically contracts with a professional service to paint these numbers on all public streets at no cost to residents. Prior to scheduling any work, the City requires that contractors notify homeowners via flyer 24-48 hours in advance. The next City-wide housing number painting project is due to take place during the months of October and November.

Please note that only City-sponsored house painting is permitted and any work such as this in the public right-of-way requires an encroachment permit to be issued by the City. If you are solicited for this type of service and asked to pay a fee, please contact City Hall immediately at 818-706-1613.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY

With witches, goblins, and superheroes descending on neighborhood streets throughout the City, Halloween should be filled with surprise and enjoyment. The following are some common sense practices which can keep "Halloween" events safe and fun:

- ◆ Children should always be accompanied by a responsible adult who has a flashlight and a cell phone in case of an emergency.
- ◆ Plan a route that uses well-lit streets with little traffic and follow all traffic and safety rules.
- ◆ Remind children to cross the street only at corners with a cross-walk or traffic-controlled intersections, look in both directions prior to crossing, and never dart out into the street from behind parked cars.
- ◆ No matter where your children trick-or-treat, the "goodies" collected need to be checked by an adult before consumption.
- ◆ Homemade items should only be eaten if obtained from trusted neighbors or friends; all others should be discarded.
- ◆ Please remember that the curfew for any young person under the age of 18 without adult supervision is 10:00 pm.
