## City's Summer Entertainment Series Presents Seven Exciting Events Beginning May 20




The City of Westlake Village kicks off its 13th Season of summer entertainment on Friday, May 20. The series begins with "Jazz Night." The multi-award winning jazz bands from both Lindero Canyon Middle School and Agoura High School will be performing. The performance starts at 7:00 pm. "Jersey Dogs" hot dog cart will be on-site offering family friendly dinners for sale.

"Jazz Night" is part of a series of seven special events sponsored by the City of Westlake Village that is geared for the entire family. Upcoming "TGIF" events at the Civic Center include "Disney Music Under the Stars" night featuring selections from Cabrillo Music Theater's production of "Little Mermaid" on July 1 and Sinatra Night featuring "Vaughn Suponatime" on August 5.



In addition to these three events, the City is proud to continue the "Saturdays in the Park" events. This summer entertainment series will feature four events on Saturday nights at Berniece Bennett Park. The Saturday programs kick off on June 18 with "The 80z All Stars," a 1980's tribute band. Additional concerts will feature "Abba Fab," a tribute to ABBA on July 16 and "Platinum Groove," a fun party band concert on August 20. "Saturdays in the Park" concerts begin at 7:00 pm. The additional Saturday night event is a "Movie in the Park" featuring "The Sandlot" on July 30. The outdoor movie will begin at approximately 8 pm.

The three TGIF events on Friday evenings are held at the Westlake Village Civic Center, 31200 Oak Crest Drive. The four "Saturdays in the Park" events will be held at Berniece Bennett Park, 31800 Village Center Drive. These outdoor performances are free to the public and families are encouraged to attend. Please bring lawn chairs and picnic baskets for these delightful early evening summer performances. As the temperatures drop in the early evening hours, don't forget to bring your sweater or jacket. Food will be available for sale at each event starting at 6:00 pm. 

# City Council Approves Music and Wine Festival

At its meeting on April 27, the City Council approved the issuance of a temporary use permit that would allow the Westlake Village Golf Course to host a day-long music and wine festival on its driving range. The event is scheduled to be held on Saturday, September 3. Although the music and wine festival is not a City event, City staff have been coordinating with event promoters since November on a variety of subjects including safety, security, traffic impacts, parking, and community outreach. The City developed a number of temporary use permit conditions including the deployment of law enforcement officers, off-site parking, and a detailed shuttle system for concert attendees. The costs associated with these services will be borne by the event promoters.

The Westlake Village Music and Wine festival will feature several nationally known "Adult Contemporary/Classic Rock" touring artists. It is anticipated that event promoters will begin to announce the artist line-up in the coming weeks. In addition, event organizers plan to open ticket sales to Westlake Village residents four days prior to the general public. A maximum of 10,000 tickets will be sold. # Summer Recreation Program Celebrates 29 Years of Fun!



The City will once again be offering a comprehensive Summer Recreation Program for young residents. Now in its twenty-ninth year, the program features affordable summer recreation activities for children ages 5-15. The fun kicks off on June 13 and runs through August 5. Residents may sign up for two-day, three-day, weekly, or entire summer camp options including Camp Westlake Village, a morning and afternoon drop-in program, morning enrichment classes, and the very popular Summer Academy program. The Summer Academy will offer week-long specialty camps in areas such as theater, Legos, and science.

The 2016 Summer Recreation brochure will be distributed to students at White Oak and St. Jude's Elementary Schools in May. All Summer Recreation Programs are held at White Oak Elementary School through an agreement between the City and the Conejo Recreation and Park District (CRPD). # Are Your Dogs Licensed?

California state law and the Westlake Village Municipal Code require that all dogs over the age of four months be licensed and vaccinated against rabies. Annual license fees for residents of Westlake Village are \$30 for unaltered dogs, \$15 for altered dogs, and \$7.50 for altered dogs owned by residents 60 years of age and older. There is a penalty fee of \$20 for a failure to apply for a license or if the owner has allowed for a license to lapse.

If you have not obtained a license or your license has lapsed (after a year), please visit the LA County Agoura Animal Shelter at 29525 Agoura Road in Agoura Hills. Shelter hours are Monday through Thursday, noon to 7:00 p.m., and Friday through Sunday, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The Shelter is closed on holidays. Dog owners should bring proof of rabies vaccination and sterilization, if applicable, to the Shelter.

Dog licenses are valid for one year. Existing licenses may be renewed on-line at <http://animalcare.lacounty.gov> or by submitting a renewal by mail.

Licensing is an important means of identification and can help residents find their pet if it becomes lost. The Shelter staff rescues lost pets and makes every effort to reunite animals with their owners. Revenue generated by the sale of licenses helps to pay for Animal Care and Control services in Westlake Village. Westlake Village receives 100% of all revenue from license sales as a credit against the cost of providing animal regulations services in the City.

## Reminder: All Dogs Must be on a Leash

The City of Westlake Village requires that all dogs be kept on a leash and under the control of their owners at all times when in an area accessible to the public. This includes public parks, schools, streets and private common areas. Any dog found roaming without a leash can be picked up by Los Angeles Animal Control and the owner maybe subject to a fine.





If You Witness an Unsafe  
Driver: Contact STTOP



The Sheriff's Teen Traffic Offender Program (STTOP) is a unique traffic safety program developed by the Lost Hills Sheriff's Station. STTOP encourages residents to report any reckless driving that they witness. Once the tips are received, a Sheriff's Deputy will contact the driver and his or her guardian (if a minor) to discuss the report and the potential serious consequences of unsafe driving. STTOP referrals to the Lost Hills Station can be made for drivers of any age. This includes speeding, driving while using their cell phone, or any other unsafe actions.
