47th Annual 4th of July Parade

Would you like to be part of a hometown tradition during the morning hours of July 4th? Residents of all ages are invited to participate in the 47th Annual Westlake Village 4th of July Parade. A full morning of activities is planned beginning with Boy Scout Troop #752's pancake breakfast located at the former hospital property at 4415 Lakeview Canyon at 8:00 am. Breakfast tickets are available for purchase for \$5 per person or \$20 per family on the day of the event. The parade will begin at the same location at 9:45 am. The parade follows a short four-block route to Berniece Bennett Park. There are many ways to

enjoy the parade. Decorate a bike, scooter, stroller, or wagon in patriotic themes or simply line the parade route and cheer on the participants. All veterans are encouraged to join in the parade.

Once at the park, the fun continues with inflatable activities, crafts, music, old fashioned park games, free popsicles and water. The Rotary Club of Westlake Village will be selling hot dogs for \$1. The event ends at 12 noon. Residents may bring a picnic or purchase food from the food vendors.

may also pack a picnic and view the fireworks from Calvary Community Church or Berniece Bennett Park. For safety reasons, please stay off the Golf Course property. Parking will be valet only in the Westlake Village Inn lot, but additional parking is available at alternative locations such as the former hospital property. Back Through Labor Day Weekend

The "Village Trolley" returned on May 27 providing free transportation between Westlake Village neighborhoods, retail areas, and restaurants. The trolley operates on Friday and Saturday nights from 3:00 to 10:00 pm through September 3.

Riding the "Village Trolley" is easy. Simply hop on at one of fifteen stops listed below and hop off whenever you want. The trolley is outfitted with a GPS locator device allowing riders to use their smartphone to track the trolley's progress. The trolley is not just transportation. Every night from 6:00 to 8:00 pm, the City provides free entertainment on the trolley to make your ride that much more enjoyable. Check the City's website for the up-to-date entertainment schedule. The "Village Trolley" is the perfect way to get to TGIF at the Civic Center and Saturday Concerts in the Park. A special Berniece Bennett Park pick-up/drop-off will be offered on June 18, July 16, July 30, and August 20 to coincide with those Saturday events.

Leash Law in Westlake Village

The City of Westlake Village requires that all dogs must be kept on a leash of 6-foot or less and under the control of their owners at all times when in an area accessible to the public. This includes public parks, schools, streets and private common areas. Any dog found roaming without a leash can be picked up by Los Angeles Animal Control and the owner can be subject to a fine. The law helps prevent dogs from getting seriously injured or lost while protecting residents.

U.S. Supreme Court Decision Affects Local Non-Profit Display Signage

On June 24, a new sign ordinance will go into effect in the City of Westlake Village. This ordinance was adopted by the City Council in response to a mandate in the form of a recent decision by the U. S. Supreme Court. While the structure of the sign ordinance will be changing, most of the standards will remain very similar to what the sign requirements within the City have been for decades. However, there is a notable change in the new sign ordinances that will affect our local community organizations.



The City of Westlake Village has had a long standing tradition of allowing local community organizations to place temporary signs advertising their community events. Usually seen for special activities or fund raising events, these signs have been placed (with City approval) at prominent corners within the City, including the fence at the Pierce Brothers Memorial Park at Lindero Canyon Road and Russell Ranch Road. Despite the City's history of allowing these types of signs, the recent Court decision will no longer permit the City to allow them. If they are permitted, then any commercial entity would be allowed to place the same type of signage, resulting in visual pollution which the City has always sought to avoid.

As of June 24, local community non-profits may place a temporary sign meeting the various standards set by the City's sign code ONLY at the location of the event. Off-site signs will be prohibited. Questions regarding this new policy may be directed to the Planning Department at (818) 706-1613.

Public Safety Corner Rattlesnake Season is Upon Us

Due to its close proximity to open space, many Westlake Village neighborhoods and businesses often encounter wildlife of all kinds. With summer around the corner, rattlesnakes are beginning to make appearances. If you encounter a rattlesnake, contact the Fire Department immediately by calling 911. Firefighters will respond and remove them. Please maintain a safe distance while keeping an eye on its whereabouts to assist firefighters in locating the snake.




To help prevent snakes from entering your property, remove the things snakes are seeking: food and shelter. Snakes find food (rodents) in wood or grass piles, gopher holes, and uncovered trashcans. Snakes seek out their own shelter in dark and shady areas such as large rocks, boxes, firewood, and tall grass cover. Residents whose homes are directly adjacent to open space may consider installing a "snake fence" around the perimeter of their property.
