Transportation Options Throughout The City and Surrounding Areas



The City's unique location along the Los Angeles/Ventura County border affords residents a variety of public transportation options. The LA Metro 161 bus service runs between the City of Thousand Oaks Transportation Center on Rancho Road and the Warner Center Transportation Hub multiple times per day. Once riders reach either transportation center, additional transportation opportunities such as the Metro Orange Bus across the San Fernando Valley, light rail throughout Los

Angeles, and buses to all areas of Ventura County including the Amtrak station in Moorpark, are available. With stops in the cities of Agoura Hills, Calabasas, and Thousand Oaks, the Metro 161 creates an easily accessible shuttle throughout the Conejo Valley and beyond.

Riding the Metro 161 is easy. There are several stops along Lindero Canyon Road and Thousand Oaks Boulevard. One-way bus fare is \$1.75. Metro offers discount rides for seniors, disabled, and students. Additionally, Metro's TAP card lets riders pre-purchase their bus fare in weekly or monthly segments at a discounted rate through its website. These fares are then loaded onto the TAP card which can be used to ride any Metro bus or rail line. For more information on the LA Metro 161 or any Metro route, visit www.metro.net.

Did you know that TO Transit, the City of Thousand Oaks bus service, stops in the City of Westlake Village?

The TO Transit Blue Line stops daily at Lakeview Canyon Road and Agoura Road. The route connects to the Thousand Oaks Transportation Center. Fare is \$1.50 each way. Westlake Village Dial-A-Ride card holders ride for free.



Construction to Begin on Final Phase of Community Park

Work is scheduled to begin on the final phase of the Westlake Community Park in early February. This work will include the development of the soccer fields, third baseball/softball field, playground areas, walking and fitness trails, a second restroom/concession stand, and sand volleyball courts. This final phase is anticipated to be completed by Fall 2017. The skate park and baseball/softball fields will remain open during this construction.



As a friendly reminder, the skate park is closed when wet. For up-to-date rain status updates for field usage sign-up for free rain status notifications under "Notify Me" on the City's website www.wvlv.org.

Citycare: Empowering Residents for Eight Years

Since its launch in 2009, the City of Westlake Village's CityCare program has provided residents the opportunity to report any maintenance or service concerns 24 hours a day/7 days a week to the City. CityCare asks residents to assist City staff by being the "eyes and ears of the community." Examples of items residents may report using the CityCare program include broken sprinklers on public property, street light outages, street repairs, and graffiti. In 2016, the City received and responded to over 161 requests.

Making a CityCare request is as easy as calling, browsing, or clicking. Residents can call City Hall at 818-706-1613 to make a report. After-hours phone calls will be taken by an answering service and routed to the appropriate staff member. CityCare can also be accessed via the City website, www.wlv.org. Residents on-the-go can use the CityCare app on their I-phone or Android device. The app can be found by clicking on the CityCare emblem on the City website.

Can't Find What You are Looking for at the Library?

Although the Westlake Village Library may not be large in terms of size, it does open patrons up to the entire Los Angeles County Library system. Library card holders have access to the County's entire catalog and may request books from other branches be sent to Westlake Village for check-out. In addition, residents may also choose to take advantage of the Library's "Interlibrary Loan" Program. The program allows patrons to go

outside the County library catalog and request items from participating library agencies across the country. Please note that a minimum of a \$3.00 fee is assessed for each "Interlibrary" item received (items acquired from the Los Angeles County Library system are not assessed a fee). Free Cert Training to be Held Beginning March 7th

Los Angeles County Fire Department offers free Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) to residents several times a year. The 8-week class provides training in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. The upcoming CERT class modules will begin on March 7th in Agoura Hills. The classes will meet from 6:30 pm to 9:00 pm in the Agoura Hills Civic Center Community Room located at 30001 Ladyface Court.

CERT graduates are encouraged to join the Westlake Village Disaster Response Team (WLVDRT). The WLVDRT is a volunteer group that provides community members with basic training designed to help them better care for themselves, their families and others in the community in the event of a disaster. Additionally, the WLVDRT recruits, equips, and maintains a well-trained citizen response team to aid the City in the event of an emergency. Members of the WLVDRT will be at the CERT training to provide more information on the Westlake Village team.
