### 23rd Annual Westlake Village Rotary Street Festival on Sunday, April 23



# Westlake Village Dog Park Donor Wall Campaign to Begin

For those animal lovers who are interested in honoring their best friend, the Westlake Village Community Foundation is kicking off the Dog Park Commemorative Donor Wall Campaign. For a limited time, City of Westlake Village residents have the opportunity to recognize a canine family member or friend on a donor seat wall specifically designed as an entrance feature into the Park. Each donor plaque can be purchased for \$500. The 6"x6" plaque will accommodate up to 40 characters of script. Plaques can also feature an image of your pet and can be purchased for \$1,200. Additional charges for plaques featuring a pet may be required depending on the quality of the artwork submitted. All funds raised will be used toward the construction and on-going maintenance of the new Dog Park.

Bread, fruit, vegetables, tea bags, coffee grounds, fish, and meat can now be accepted in the green bin. Place the items in your bin alongside your tree trimmings and leaves. Feel free to throw in the extra takeout food but place all food containers in the trash bin.


## Public Safety Corner Licensing Your Bicycle



With warm temperatures in full force, many people are pulling out their bicycles and hitting the road. The Sheriff's Department wants to remind residents that the best way to protect your bike after hours is to lock it up at night. Residents are encouraged to lock their doors and close their garages to help avoid unnecessary attention.

Another way to protect your bike is by registering it with the National Bike Registry (NBR). Since 1984, the NBR has been working with law enforcement to return stolen bikes to their rightful owners. A bike registered with NBR, may be identified by police and returned. If a resident registers, they are sent a Certificate of Registration and a tamper-resistant NBR label to identify their bike.
