PROGRAM CELEBRATES

30 YEARS OF FUN!

The City will once again be offering a comprehensive Summer Recreation Program for young residents. Now in its thirtieth year, the program features affordable summer recreation activities for children ages 5-15. The fun kicks off on June 19 and runs through August 11. Residents may sign up for Camp Westlake Village for weekly summer camp options for \$50 a week or an entire 8 weeks of summer camp for only \$400. The Summer Academy offers week-long specialty camps in areas such as theater, Legos, cooking, computers, and science.

All Summer Recreation Programs are held at White Oak Elementary School through an agreement between the City and the Conejo Recreation and Park District (CRPD). VILLAGE TROLLEY

ROLLS BACK THROUGH TOWN BEGINNING MAY 26

The "Village Trolley" returns on May 26 providing free transportation between Westlake Village neighborhoods, retail areas, and restaurants. The trolley will be operating on Friday and Saturday nights from 3:00 to 10:00 pm through September 2.

Riding the "Village Trolley" is easy. Simply hop on and off at any one of the fifteen stops around town. The trolley is outfitted with a GPS locator device allowing riders to use their smartphone to track the trolley's progress. The trolley is not just transportation. Every night from 6:00 to 8:00 pm, the City provides free entertainment on the trolley to make your ride that much more enjoyable. Check the City's website for the up-to-date entertainment schedule. The "Village Trolley" is the perfect way to get to TGIF at the Civic Center and Saturday Concerts in the Park. A special Berniece Bennett Park pick-up/drop-off will be offered on June 17, July 15, July 29, and August 26 to coincide with those Saturday events.

LEASH LAW IN WESTLAKE VILLAGE



The City of Westlake Village requires that all dogs be kept on a leash and under the control of their owners at all times when in an area accessible to the public. This includes public parks, schools, streets and private common areas. Any dog found roaming without a leash can be picked up by Los Angeles Animal Control and the owner can be subject to fines. The law helps prevent dogs from getting seriously injured or lost while protecting residents.

SUMMER ENTERTAINMENT SERIES KICKS OFF ON JUNE 2

The City of Westlake Village kicks off its 14th Season of summer entertainment on Friday, June 2. The series begins with “Jazz Night.” The multi-award winning jazz bands from both Lindero Canyon Middle School and Agoura High School will be performing. The performance starts at 7:00 pm. “Jersey Dogs” hot dog and “Apollo’s Espresso and Shave Ice” food trucks will be on-site offering family friendly dinners for sale.

“Jazz Night” is part of a series of seven special events sponsored by the City of Westlake Village that is geared for the entire family. Upcoming “TGIF” events at the Civic Center include “Stories Turned Into Musicals” night featuring selections from Cabrillo Music Theater’s production of “Peter Pan” on June 30 and a musical night with songstress Bonnie Bowden on August 11.

In addition to these three events, the City is proud to continue the “Saturdays in the Park” events. This summer entertainment series will feature four events on Saturday nights at Berniece Bennett Park. The Saturday programs kick off on June 17 with “The Police Experience”, a tribute to “The Police” band. Additional concerts will feature “Bella Donna,” a tribute to Stevie Nicks and

Fleetwood Mac on July 15 and “Hollywood U2,” a tribute to U2 on August 26. “Saturdays in the Park” concerts begin at 7:00 pm. The additional Saturday event is a “Movie in the Park” night featuring “Finding Dory” on July 29. The outdoor movie will begin at approximately 8:00 pm but activities including Captain Carl’s Mobile Tidepool begin at 6:00 pm.

The three TGIF events on Friday evenings are held at the Westlake Village Civic Center, 31200 Oak Crest Drive. The four “Saturdays in the Park” events will be held at Berniece Bennett Park, 31800 Village Center Drive. These outdoor performances are free to the public and families are encouraged to attend. Please bring lawn chairs and picnic baskets for these delightful early evening summer performances. As the temperatures drop in the early evening hours, don’t forget to bring your sweater or jacket. Food will be available for sale at each event starting at 6:00 pm. ARE YOUR DOGS LICENSED?

California State Law and the Westlake Village Municipal Code require that all dogs over the age of four months be licensed and must be vaccinated against rabies. Annual license fees are \$30 for unaltered dogs, \$15 for altered dogs, and \$7.50 for altered dogs owned by residents 60 years of age and older. Proof of the owner’s age will be required if applying for the senior citizen rate for altered dogs. There is a penalty fee of \$30 for a failure to apply for a license or if the owner has allowed a license to lapse.

If you have not obtained a license or your license has lapsed (after a year), please visit the LA County Agoura Animal Shelter at 29525 Agoura Road in Agoura Hills. Shelter hours are Monday through Thursday, noon to 7:00 p.m., and Friday through Sunday, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The Shelter is closed on holidays. Dog owners should bring proof of rabies vaccination and sterilization, if applicable, to the Shelter.

Dog licenses are valid for one year. Existing licenses may be renewed on-line at <http://animalcare.lacounty.gov> with a credit or debit card payment or by submitting a renewal by mail.

Licensing is an important means of identification and can help residents find their pet if it becomes lost. The Shelter staff rescues lost pets and makes every effort to reunite animals with their owners. Revenue generated by the sale of licenses helps to pay for Animal Care and Control services in Westlake Village. Westlake Village receives 100% of all revenue from license sales as a credit against the cost of providing animal regulation services in the City.

PUBLIC SAFETY CORNER

As spring is in full force and summer is almost upon us, residents may notice that coyotes, possums, and snakes are out and about. Open space areas and homes adjacent to open space may see more of these creatures. Here are a few helpful tips for dealing with the nature in our backyards:

- Do not leave small pets outdoors unattended.
- Always monitor small children when outdoors.
- Do not leave food outdoors.
- Keep garbage can lids tightly closed.
- Remove items that animals could use to seek shelter, food, or water.

Aggressive coyote behavior should be reported immediately to the City's Planning Department by calling 818-706-1613. For snake removal, residents should call the fire station at 818-889-1626.
