48th Annual 4th of July Parade

Residents of all ages are invited to participate in the 48th Annual Westlake Village 4th of July Parade. A full morning of activities is planned beginning with Boy Scout Troop #752's pancake breakfast located at the former hospital property at 4415 Lakeview Canyon at 8:00 am. Breakfast tickets are available to purchase for \$5 per person or \$20 per family on the day of the event. The parade will begin at the same location at 9:45 am. The parade follows a short four-block route to Berniece Bennett Park. There are many ways to enjoy the parade. Decorate a bike, scooter, stroller, or wagon in patriotic themes or simply line the parade route and cheer on the participants. All veterans are encouraged to join in the parade.

Once at the park, the fun continues with inflatable activities, crafts, music, old fashioned park games, free popsicles and water. The Rotary Club of Westlake Village will be selling hot dogs for \$2. The event ends at 12 noon. The parking lot at the Golf Course is only available for drop offs, however additional parking is available at alternative locations such as the former hospital property. The "Village Trolley" returned on May 26 providing free transportation between Westlake Village neighborhoods, retail areas, and restaurants. The trolley is operating on Friday and Saturday nights from 3:00 to 10:00 pm through September 2.

Riding the "Village Trolley" is easy. Simply hop on at one of fifteen stops listed to the right and hop off whenever you want. The trolley is outfitted with a


GPS locator device allowing riders to use their smartphone to track the trolley's progress. The trolley is not just transportation. 
What is composting and how do I start?

Composting is the decomposition of plant remains and other once-living materials to make an earthy, dark, crumbly substance that is excellent for adding to houseplants or enriching garden soil. It is the way to recycle your yard and kitchen wastes, and is a critical step in reducing the volume of garbage needlessly sent to landfills for disposal.

City residents are eligible to receive one free tumbler-type home composting container. There are a limited amount of units available per year so call now! Residents may request the tumbler by calling (805) 522-9400. There is a \$25 delivery fee and you have to assemble the composter at home.

PUBLIC SAFETY CORNER

RATTLESNAKE SEASON IS UPON US

Due to its close proximity to open space, many Westlake Village neighborhoods and businesses often encounter wildlife of all kinds. With summer around the corner, rattlesnakes are beginning to make appearances. If you encounter a rattlesnake, contact the Fire Department immediately by calling 911. Firefighters will respond and remove them. Please maintain a safe distance while keeping an eye on its whereabouts to assist firefighters in locating the snake.

To help prevent snakes from entering your property, remove the things snakes are seeking: food and shelter. Snakes find food (rodents) in wood or grass piles, gopher holes, and uncovered trashcans. Snakes seek out their own shelter in dark and shady areas such as large rocks, boxes, firewood, and tall grass cover. Residents whose homes are directly adjacent to open space may consider installing a "snake fence" around the perimeter of their property.
