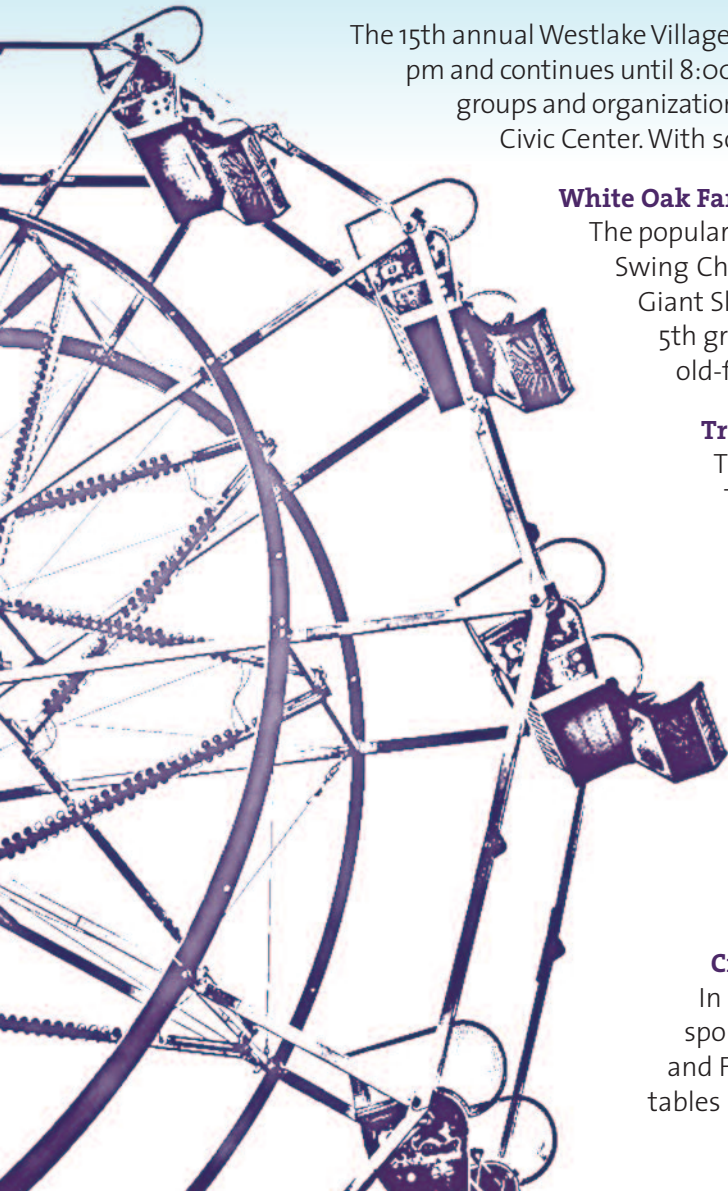
Dance Zone, Entertainment, and Games

WILDFIRE READINESS

Fire officials are predicting a strong possibility of wildfires for the Santa Monica Mountains area. This prediction is attributed to the excess growth of plants in last winter and spring and the effects of the very hot summer. In response to this prediction, the Los Angeles County Fire Department has increased its initial response levels to local wildfires.

Residents can play a key role in not only helping to prevent wildfire, but by making the area around their property more defensible. The Fire Department's "Ready-Set-Go" Personal Wildfire Action Plan provides information on creating a defensible home along with additional information on evacuations, and other pertinent material. 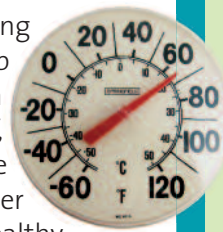


The Cultural Recreation Advisory Board was established in 2003 to advise the City Council on cultural and recreational programs, special events and City parks. Board members also sit on six sub-committees including WLV Senior, WLV Entertains, and WLV Reads. The Board currently consists of twelve adults, all of whom are appointed by the City Council. Board meetings are typically held every other month at 7:00 pm. The appointment is for a two-year term.

COOLER TEMPERATURES MARK THE TIME TO CHANGE THERMOSTATS, SPRINKLERS, AND CLEAN OUT THE GUTTERS

As the temperatures start to feel like fall, it is time to look at adjusting your thermostats to help bring electrical bills back down and to help prevent overtaxing the electrical grids (happens most often in summer months). In addition, as the scorching temperatures fall off, residents should take-a-look at their sprinkler systems and adjust the amount of time to reflect a lessened need for water. When leaves wither and fall, they start to gather in your gutters, drains, and pools. A healthy clean-out schedule helps to prevent ponding, pooling, and fire hazards. Take a day outside to prep for fall and enjoy the cooler temperatures.



PUBLIC SAFETY CORNER HALLOWEEN SAFETY

With witches, goblins, and super-heroes descending on neighborhoods throughout the City streets, Halloween should be filled with surprise and enjoyment. The following are some common sense practices which can keep "Halloween" events safe and fun:

- Children should always be accompanied by a responsible adult who has a flashlight and a cell phone in case of an emergency.
- Plan a route that uses well-lit streets with little traffic and follow all traffic and safety rules.

- Remind children to cross the street only at corners with a cross-walk or traffic-controlled intersection, look in both directions prior to crossing, and never dart out into the street from behind parked cars.
- No matter where your children trick-or-treat, the "goodies" collected need to be checked by an adult before consumption. Homemade items should only be eaten if obtained from trusted neighbors or friends; all others should be discarded.
- Please remember that the curfew for any young person under the age of 18 without adult supervision is 10:00 pm.

WESTLAKE VILLAGE CENTURY BIKE RIDE

TO BE HELD ON OCTOBER 7

The third annual Westlake Village Century Ride is a large bike ride in the Conejo Valley that offers four different route options that range from 15 to 100 miles around the community. The race starts and ends at the Westlake Village Inn's Stonehaus property on Saturday, October 7. This bike ride is a "rules of the road" ride requiring no traffic control cones or signage in the City. As all of the long-distance races begin at the same time, there will be Sheriff's deputies controlling rolling closures at 7:00 am to help the cyclists clear out of Westlake Village quickly. The rolling closures will occur along Agoura Road from the main entrance of the Westlake Village Inn heading eastbound on Agoura Road. This will impact the intersections on Agoura Road from First Neighborhood to the Agoura Hills border including Lindero Canyon Road. Traffic is anticipated to be impacted for no more than 10 minutes for each rolling closure along the route. In addition, there will be a brief delay for westbound traffic on Agoura Road of no more than 5 minutes at 10:30 am in order to allow the Family Ride to clear the Westlake Village Inn driveway and turn left onto Lakeview Canyon Road.
