SENIOR OPPORTUNITIES IN WESTLAKE VILLAGE

The City offers a variety of programs specifically designed for its senior residents. These programs include five sessions of the senior adult recreation program, Dial-A-Ride transportation service, senior genius club, and special lectures provided by Senior Concerns.

Senior Recreation

Do you know how to use your smart phone? Are you interested in sharpening your bridge skills or do you love to be active? The popular Westlake Village Senior Adult Recreation Program currently offers 19 classes including a drawing class, mat pilates course, and an Apple Computer class. Additional classes include yoga, T'ai Chi, Zumba Gold, and bridge. These classes are offered through an agreement with the Conejo Recreation and Park District. City residents over the age of 55 can register for \$5 per class session (3, 4, or 8-week sessions). All classes are held at the Westlake Village Civic Center. Senior Genius Club is Back!

The Senior Genius Club continues to be offered on the first, second, and third Tuesdays of the month at Agoura High School's Media Center from 3:30 - 5:30 pm. Agoura High School is located at 28545 W. Driver Ave, Agoura Hills, CA 91301. Follow the parking lot signs to find the location. The parking area and room are wheelchair and walker-accessible, however, there is a short walk to get to the center.



Help will be offered in thirty-minute increments for one topic at a time. The "tech experts" are high school students who are earning volunteer hours while serving their community. The service is free and open to all ages that may need some technological help. This program is jointly sponsored by the Cities of Westlake Village and Agoura Hills. Senior and Disabled Dial-A-Ride

Dial-A-Ride is a service for residents over the age of 65 or those with a disability that prevents them from driving. Rides are available throughout the Cities of Westlake Village and Thousand Oaks. Dial-A-Ride also provides limited service for medical or employment related trips to Agoura Hills. Eligible residents need to obtain a free Dial-A-Ride card from City Hall. The City offers the program through a contract agreement with the City of Thousand Oaks with service 7 days a week. BENEFITS OF WEEKLY STREET SWEEPING

The City of Westlake Village takes great pride in the community's well-maintained streets and public landscaped areas. Toward that end, the City contracts for street sweeping service on a weekly basis. In addition, the weekly sweeping helps to prevent unwanted materials from entering the storm drains, creeks, and the lake. The City's street sweeping occurs on Thursdays and Fridays each week.

With the fall weather and leaves beginning to fall, residents are asked to help maximize street sweeping effectiveness by parking off the roadway on their neighborhood cleaning day.
