

CITY TO CELEBRATE DEDICATION OF THE WESTLAKE VILLAGE COMMUNITY PARK ON JANUARY 21

The culmination of 20 years of planning, fundraising, grants, and public input will come to fruition on Sunday, January 21 from 12 noon to 4 pm with the dedication of the newly completed Westlake Village Community Park. The event will feature a formal ceremony at 12 noon honoring the partnerships, sponsors, donors, and key players that made this valuable regional facility possible. The ceremony will be followed by youth sports demonstrations, photo opportunities, a passport to visit all the features at the park, fitness equipment instruction, games, and a selection of free food. Dodger Alumni Ron Cey will be one of the speakers during the ceremony and available for some photo opportunities until 1 pm. Please come celebrate this momentous occasion with your community!



The approximate 18-acre site includes the City's park improvements and the 55,000 square foot Triunfo YMCA facility which has yet to be completed. The Westlake Village Community Park contains eight acres of lighted, synthetic turf athletic fields for soccer, football, baseball, softball, and other sports, a walking/jogging trail, skate park, picnic areas, outdoor volleyball and basketball courts, fitness equipment, restroom/concession facilities, and children's play areas. The Westlake Village Community Park will provide much needed field and court space to support existing youth sports organizations, while creating more recreational and event space for all residents to enjoy. The park is located at 31107 Thousand Oaks Boulevard. There is a one-way entrance and a one-way exit off Thousand Oaks Boulevard that can be accessed by vehicle, bicycle, or sidewalk during park hours.

CELEBRATES THE HEART OF WESTLAKE VILLAGE THROUGH MULTIPLE PROGRAMS ON FEBRUARY 10

The City of Westlake Village, the Westlake Village Library, and the Friends of the Westlake Village Library are co-sponsoring the 9th annual "Westlake Village Reads", a One-City-One-Book program. This year's theme, "Come Together: The Heart of Westlake Village" will be presented through six programs for residents of all ages in one day. In between the programs will be a very special non-profit fair for residents to find ways to give back to the community and to share their passions with agencies that need assistance. Programs will include memoir writing, positive mindfulness, writing for teens, teen art program, an anti-bully magic show for children, and an international storyteller for children. All programs are free of charge.

The Library will display a variety of "community, heart, and acceptance" themed books including both adult and children's book titles. Residents are encouraged to select titles that fit their personal interests throughout the month of February. The Friends' Book Nook will be creating a special "Come Together" section for residents that wish to purchase a book to read along with the program.

AS WINTER IS UPON US, HERE ARE THREE SIMPLE HOUSEHOLD REMINDERS

As the winter season brings cooler temperatures and increased potential for rain, it is a good time for residents to check on several items in and around our homes:

Rain Gutters

Remove debris and leaves in your roof gutters and yard drains. If you live on a hill, clear all swales to ensure that water flows through them properly. Also, check to make sure your yard drains are cleared to prevent ponding. Some of these preventative measures may be the responsibility of your Homeowners Association. First check your property and then contact your Homeowners Association to be sure they are prepared as well.



Sprinkler Settings

With the temperatures dropping steadily and the amount of daylight dwindling, homeowners who rely on automatic sprinklers can save money and water by adjusting the sprinkler settings for the winter season. Additional guidelines can be found on the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District website, www.lvmwd.com. Remember to turn off your sprinklers if it is raining.



Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors

The first of the year is a great time to change the batteries and test your household smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Remember, the State's Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Prevention Act requires the installation of operational carbon monoxide detectors in existing multi-family residential units containing a fossil-fuel burning appliance, fireplace or attached garage.




HAVE YOU CHECKED OUT THE BOOK NOOK?
