49th Annual 4th of July Parade

Residents of all ages are invited to participate in the 49th Annual Westlake Village 4th of July Parade. A full morning of activities is planned beginning with Boy Scout Troop #752's pancake breakfast located at the former hospital property at 4415 Lakeview Canyon at 8:00 am. Breakfast tickets are available to purchase for \$5 per person or \$20 per family on the day of the event. The parade will begin at the same location at 9:45 am. The parade follows a short four-block route to Berniece Bennett Park. There are many ways to enjoy the parade. Decorate a bike, scooter, stroller, or wagon in patriotic themes or simply line the parade route and cheer on the participants. All veterans are encouraged to join in the parade.

Once at the park, the fun continues with inflatable activities, crafts, music, old fashioned park games, free popsicles and water. The Rotary Club of Westlake Village will be selling hot dogs for \$2. The event ends at 12 noon. Don't miss the City's number one special event! The 4th of July fireworks will be launched from the Westlake Village Golf Course and reach altitudes of 500 feet. The driving range at the Westlake Village Golf Course will be open to the public at 5:00 pm with free seating, food trucks, games, and entertainment that will all lead up to the incredible fireworks show at 9:10 pm. Residents may bring a picnic or purchase food or alcohol from the food vendors. Per the California ABC, no outside alcohol is allowed onto the Golf Course property and bags and coolers will be searched before entry.

As the display will be viewable from multiple locations throughout the City, residents may wish to consider a backyard barbecue or block-party prior to the 9:10 pm show. Residents may also pack a picnic and view the fireworks from Calvary Community Church or Berniece Bennett Park. For safety reasons, please stay off the Golf Course property. The parking lot at the Golf Course is only available for drop offs, however additional parking is available at alternative locations such as the former hospital property. TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

A long-standing goal of the City Council may be achieved in the near future. The City is currently in discussions with a company which is interested in implementing a fiber optic network within the City. At complete build-out, the proposed network would allow for a Fiber-to-the-Home (FTTH) system for every property within the City. FTTH would allow for extremely high volumes of data to be transmitted to and from a given point at extremely high speeds. This would facilitate the delivery of telephone voice transmission, video and television services, and internet services (to include streaming audio and video) at speeds and capacities capable of handling current and future needs of residents and businesses in the City.

Installation of this system would involve the trenching of streets to lay the fiber optic cable. Such work could result in two or three days of construction on a given street. While City approval is not required for a company to install this system, any construction work done would be subject to City construction standards and limitations, including approved construction hours through an encroachment permit.

Installation work could begin as soon as this summer, and will likely begin in the First Neighborhood, with other neighborhoods to follow. Information from the network provider will be sent to residents in the coming months to determine interest in subscribing to this service. ENJOY SUMMERTIME AT THE CITY PARKS

The City has seven parks including Berniece Bennett, Canyon Oaks, Foxfield, Russell Ranch, Three Springs, Westlake Village Community Park, and Westlake Village Dog Park (currently nearing completion). The parks are open for public use between dawn and dusk of the same day with the exception of Berniece Bennett, Three Springs Park, and Westlake Community Park. During the summer months, (June, July, August, and September) Berniece Bennett and Three Springs Parks are open from 6 a.m. until 10:30 p.m. daily. The Westlake Village Community Park is open at 6 a.m. and closes at 10 p.m. year-round. The Community Park sports fields close at 9 p.m. and the skate park closes at dusk. All parks are non-reservable and can be used on a first come first served basis only. Only the ball fields at Russell Ranch Park and Westlake Community Park can be reserved for local youth organizations to practice and play. Residents interested in possibly hosting a birthday party or special event at a park need to fill out a special event application. The special event permit and all required information is available by visiting www.wlv.org and searching "Special Event Permit". Moonbounces and other inflatables are permitted in the City's parks with the exception of the Community Park; however, residents are required to obtain a permit from the City. Bouncers are limited to one per party and the inflatable cannot be staked into the park grounds. Also water units are not permitted. The bouncer application form is available by searching "Bouncer application" on the City's website. There is no fee to file the application.
