
RETURNS ON OCTOBER 20TH!

SENIOR GENIUS CLUB

SUCCESSFUL SENIOR GENIUS CLUB TO RETURN



The Senior Genius Club program held at Agoura High School's Media Center will be resuming service in September three days per month. The Senior Genius Club is a program developed to assist seniors with technological help, provide community service hours for the teens that volunteer and run the program, and create an opportunity to increase intergenerational communication. The program will be offered the first, second,

and third Tuesday of the month at Agoura High School from 3:30-5:30 pm. This year's program will begin on October 2 and run through May 2019. Seniors may follow the street signs for the closest parking areas and will be greeted by the student participants. Once seniors arrive at the media center, they will sign in and then be assigned to a teen that has expertise in the area requested by the senior. The tasks can be as simple as posting on Facebook, creating an account, updating malware on browsers, establishing a password system, using their phones, tablets, or laptops and much more.

The original program began in late 2016 offering two days a month through a sponsorship from the City of Westlake Village. This year, the City has continued a partnership with the City of Agoura Hills to open the program to seniors in both cities. The program is free and appointments are open on a first-come, first-served basis. Each student is able to help a senior with a 30-minute appointment before having to move on to additional seniors that need help. The last appointment time is 5:00 pm. Both cities would like to thank Agoura High School Principal Dr. Stephanie McClay and staff member Lena Goryoka for making the program a success and opening up Agoura's beautiful facility to the community. PUBLIC SAFETY CORNER FREE C.E.R.T. TRAINING TO BE HELD BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 18



The Los Angeles County Fire Department offers free Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) to residents several times a year. The 7-week class provides training in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations. The upcoming fall CERT class modules will begin on

September 18th in Agoura Hills. The classes will meet from 6:30 pm to 9:00 pm in the Agoura Hills Civic Center Community Room located at 30001 Ladyface Court.

CERT graduates are encouraged to join the Westlake Village Disaster Response Team (WLV DRT). The WLV DRT is a volunteer group that provides community members with basic training designed to help them better care for themselves, their families and others in the community in the event of a disaster. Additionally, the WLV DRT recruits, equips, and maintains a well-trained citizen response team to aid the City in the event of an emergency. Members of the WLV DRT will be at an upcoming CERT training to provide more information on the Westlake Village team. CONSERVING WATER – PROTECTING OUR CITY

Did you know that inefficient watering methods and systems can result in a significant amount of water waste and higher water bills? As the state of California strives to achieve its mandated 25% state-wide water use reduction, it is vitally important that we as a community help to eliminate water waste. Fortunately, there are a few easy steps that you can undertake to help eliminate irrigation runoff and save on your water bill.



Use this checklist to reduce water usage, preserve the environment, and cut water costs:

- Check sprinkler system frequently and adjust units so that only plants and lawn are watered
- Water small lawn patches by hand
- Aerate lawns to allow water to reach roots rather than runoff the surface
- Check sprinkler system or drip lines periodically for leaks and broken equipment
- Replace sprinklers with drip irrigation
- Use a screwdriver to test soil moisture – if pushed into the soil easily, no need to water
