This is based on excessive growth of brush last winter and spring along with the effects of a very hot summer. As a result, the Los Angeles County Fire Department has increased its initial response levels to local wildfires.

Residents can play a key role in not only helping to prevent wildfire, but by making the area around their property more defensible. The Fire Department's "Ready-Set-Go" Personal Wildfire Action Plan provides information on creating a defensible home along with additional information on evacuations and other pertinent material. Board members also sit on two sub-committees including WLV Seniors and WLV Reads. The Board currently consists of ten adults and four youth members, all of whom are appointed by the City Council. Board meetings are typically held every other month at 7:00 pm. The appointment is for a two-year term.

PUBLIC SAFETY CORNER

HALLOWEEN SAFETY

With witches, goblins, and super-heroes descending on neighborhoods throughout the City streets, Halloween should be filled with surprise and enjoyment. The following are some common sense practices which can keep "Halloween" events safe and fun:

- Children should always be accompanied by a responsible adult who has a flashlight and a cell phone in case of an emergency.
- Plan a route that uses well-lit streets with little traffic and follow all traffic and safety rules.
- Remind children to cross the street only at corners with a cross-walk or traffic-controlled intersection, look in both directions prior to crossing, and never dart out into the street from behind parked cars.
- No matter where your children trick-or-treat, the "goodies" collected need to be checked by an adult before consumption. Homemade items should only be eaten if obtained from trusted neighbors or friends; all others should be discarded.
- Please remember that the curfew for any young person under the age of 18 without adult supervision is 10:00 pm.

DOG PARK REMINDERS AND UPDATES

With the end of daylight savings time just around the corner, the closing time at the City's new dog park will soon be adjusted. Effective October 1 through May 31, the park will close at 5:00 pm. However, the park will continue to open at 7:00 am. Residents are asked to help everyone enjoy the park by following the parking signs, rules of use, and being courteous to the neighbors who reside near the park.



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

As mentioned in the August City News work has started on the Lindero Sidewalk and Beautification Project and the Street Improvement Project.
