## WESTLAKE BUSINESS PARK SPECIFIC PLAN UPDATE

After a delay in processing due to the Woolsey Fire and subsequent recovery efforts, finishing touches are being made to the Business Park Specific Plan, which covers areas of the City north of the 101 Freeway, south of Thousand Oaks Boulevard and west of Lindero Canyon Road. This document will provide a new land use plan intended to incentivize re-investment in these properties while minimizing traffic congestion and other impacts. The draft version of the plan is expected to be presented to the Planning Department for public review in mid-February with the public review period for the Environmental Impact Report running from that date until early April. Public review of the Specific Plan document will continue until the hearing date, which is anticipated to be in early-to mid-May. # FREE CERT TRAINING

TO BE HELD BEGINNING MARCH 26<sup>th</sup>



Los Angeles County Fire Department offers free Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) to residents several times a year. The 8-week class provides training in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations. The

upcoming CERT class modules will begin on March 26<sup>th</sup> in Agoura Hills. The classes will meet from 6:30 pm to 9:00 pm in the Agoura Hills Civic Center Community Room located at 30001 Ladyface Court. If you are interested in taking the free CERT courses, you may register online at [www.fire.lacounty.gov/cert](http://www.fire.lacounty.gov/cert), by simply scrolling down to the Agoura Hills listing, then clicking on the “register” link.

CERT graduates are encouraged to join the Westlake Village Disaster Response Team (WLVDR). The WLVDR is a volunteer group that provides community members with basic training designed to help them better care for themselves, their families and others in the community in the event of a disaster. Additionally, the WLVDR recruits, equips, and maintains a well-trained citizen response team to aid the City in the event of an emergency. Members of the WLVDR will be at the CERT training to provide more information on the Westlake Village team. ## EMPOWERING RESIDENTS FOR TEN YEARS



Since its launch in 2009, the City of Westlake Village’s CityCare program has provided residents the opportunity to report any maintenance or service concerns 24 hours a day/7 days a week to the City. CityCare asks residents to assist City staff by being the “eyes and ears of the community.” Examples of items residents may report using the CityCare program include broken sprinklers on public property, street light outages, street repairs and graffiti. In 2018, the City received and responded to over 108 requests.

Making a CityCare request is as easy as calling, browsing, or clicking. Residents can call City Hall at 818-706-1613 to make a report. After-hours phone calls will be taken by an answering service and routed to the appropriate staff member. ### YOUR CITY TAKES PREPAREDNESS SERIOUSLY... SO SHOULD YOU!

With the recent fires and storms affecting the region, the City of Westlake Village wants to remind you that we are constantly preparing to deal with the next big emergency. While dangerous wildfires and mudslides may be at the forefront of our minds, the City undertakes considerable effort to ensure that we’re prepared to deal with threats of many kinds, ranging from wildfires and earthquakes, all the way to terrorism and public health emergencies.

The City of Westlake Village, as a contract city, partners with multiple agencies in order to provide public safety services. The Los Angeles County Sheriff’s Department is responsible for police services throughout the city, while the Los Angeles County Fire Department provides fire protection services. Both of these agencies are the primary responders for nearly all emergencies within the city, regardless of the size or type. The City works in conjunction with both of these agencies to carry out a variety of responsibilities, in line with State and Federal regulations, should an emergency warrant such a response.

Emergency preparedness is a responsibility that we all share. While the City spends a great deal of time to ensure that we’re prepared to do our part, it’s critically important that residents ensure they’re prepared as well. Please take the time to evaluate your readiness to deal with a potential disaster. To help guide you in that effort, the City’s website provides some important information and tips on this subject, including how to sign up to receive City emergency notifications, brush clearance suggestions, preparedness checklists and more.
