


BUSINESS PARK SPECIFIC PLAN UPDATE

Following many years of careful study and planning, the City released for public review a draft of the Business Park Specific Plan and the accompanying Environmental Impact Report (as of March 29). This plan, if adopted, will set the City's policy for the future development and use of properties within the Business Park areas north of the 101 freeway. Along with guiding development of private properties, the plan will also address improvements to public facilities and infrastructure, including the future development of sidewalks in the area. The draft Plan and draft EIR are available for review at the Library, at City Hall, or can be downloaded from the City's website at <http://www.wlv.org/220/North-Business-Park-Specific-Plan>.

The review and comment period for the EIR will last until May 15, though comments on the plan can be submitted to the City right up until the hearing date, which may be held in June. The plan was discussed at the regular City Council meeting on April 24th. Please join us for an open house on May 11 from 10:00 am to noon in the Community Room. Please plan to attend one or more of these events. Please note that these events are for educational and public comment purposes, and will not involve any decision on the draft Plan or the EIR. Such decisions can only take place at a noticed public hearing. 


ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS AVAILABLE NOW

The City of Westlake Village is excited to bring yet another great amenity to its residents and visitors. Beginning this month, twenty-two publicly accessible electric vehicle charging stations will come online to further the City's commitment to investing in clean air and sustainable practices. As one of the largest per-capita installations of any city around, six stations are located at the Westlake Village Civic Center and sixteen at the Westlake Village Community Park. These projects were completed in partnership and funding provided by the City of Westlake Village, the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee of the South Coast Air Quality Management

District, Southern California Edison's ChargeReady

program and ChargePoint Inc. All of the stations are networked through the ChargePoint mobile app where users can register to see which stations are available, track your usage, join a wait list or monitor pricing among many other features. Whether you own an electric vehicle now, or are considering one for the future, the City's charging stations ensure you have convenient and affordable access to charging throughout Westlake Village.



SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

The Westlake Village Community Foundation is currently accepting applications for the 2019 Westlake Village Community Foundation Scholarship program. This year, the Foundation is offering scholarships to graduating senior students who have had significant involvement in either the Music, Art or Performing Arts program at their high school or in the community, or have contributed to the community through volunteer work or community service. LEASH LAW IN WESTLAKE VILLAGE

The City of Westlake Village requires that all dogs be kept on a leash and under the control of their owners at all times when in an area accessible to the public. This includes public parks, schools, streets and private common areas open to the public. The Westlake Village Dog Park requires dogs to be leashed until they are in the fenced entrance area. Any dog found roaming without a leash can be picked up by Los Angeles County Animal Control and the owner can be subject to fines. The law helps prevent dogs from getting seriously injured or lost while protecting residents.
