

WESTLAKE VILLAGE IS THE PLACE TO BE ON JULY 4th!

50th Annual 4th of July Parade

Residents of all ages are invited to participate in the 50th Annual Westlake Village 4th of July Parade. A full morning of activities is planned beginning with Boy Scout Troop #752's pancake breakfast located at the former hospital property, 4415 Lakeview Canyon at 8:00 am. Breakfast tickets are available to purchase for \$5 per person or \$20 per family on the day of the event. The parade will begin at the same location at 9:45 am. The parade follows a short four-block route to Berniece Bennett Park.

To celebrate 50 years, the City will have a Grand Marshall leading the parade in a special Westlake Village golf cart float. This year's Grand Marshall is John McDonough, the City's first mayor and one of our original City Councilmembers. There will be five themed golf carts celebrating 50 years in our community. In addition, the City will be celebrating the five decades of hometown tradition with themed costume

contests. We invite residents to come to the parade dressed as their favorite decade 1969, 1979, 1989, 1999, or 2009 or in their most patriotic gear. The costume contests will be judged at 9:15 am in the parade line-up area. Decorate a bike, scooter, stroller or wagon in patriotic themes or simply line the parade route and cheer on the participants. Dogs are encouraged to participate provided they are on a leash. We even have a costume contest category for your patriotic pooches. All veterans are encouraged to join in the parade.

Once at the park, the fun continues with inflatable activities, crafts, music, old fashioned park games, free popsicles and water. The Rotary Club of Westlake Village will be selling hot dogs for \$2. The event ends at 12 noon. Don't miss the City's number one special event! The 4th of July fireworks will be launched from the Westlake Village Golf Course and reach altitudes of 500 feet. The driving range at the Westlake Village Golf Course will be open to the public at 5:00 pm with free seating, food trucks, games and entertainment that will all lead up to the incredible fireworks show at 9:10 pm. Residents may bring a picnic or purchase food or alcohol from food vendors. Per the California ABC, no outside alcohol is allowed onto the Golf Course property and bags and coolers will be searched before entry.

The display will be viewable from multiple locations throughout the City, residents may wish to consider a backyard barbeque or block-party prior to the 9:10 pm show. Residents may also pack a picnic and view the fireworks from Calvary Community Church or Berniece Bennett Park. For safety reasons, please stay off the Golf Course property. The parking lot at the Golf Course is only available for drop offs, however additional parking is available at alternative locations such as the former hospital property. VILLAGE TROLLEY

BACK THROUGH LABOR DAY WEEKEND



The "Village Trolley" returned on May 24 providing free transportation between Westlake Village neighborhoods, retail areas and restaurants. The trolley operates on Friday and Saturday nights from 3:00 to 10:00 pm through August 31.

Riding the "Village Trolley" is easy. Simply hop on or off at one of sixteen stops listed to the right. The trolley is outfitted with a GPS locator device allowing riders to use their smartphone to track the trolley's progress. Every night from 6:00 to 8:00 pm, the City provides free entertainment on the trolley to make your ride that much more enjoyable. Check the City's website for the up-to-date entertainment schedule. The "Village Trolley" is the perfect way to get to TGIF at the Civic Center and Saturday Concerts in the Park. A special Berniece Bennett Park pick-up/drop-off will be offered on June 15, July 13, July 27 and August 24 to coincide with those Saturday events.



RATTLESNAKE SEASON IS UPON US

Due to Westlake Village's close proximity to open space, many neighborhoods and businesses often encounter wildlife of all kinds. With summer around the corner, rattlesnakes are beginning to make an appearance. If you encounter a rattlesnake, contact the Fire Department immediately by calling 911. Firefighters will respond and remove them. Please maintain a safe distance while keeping an eye on its whereabouts to assist firefighters in locating the snake.

To help prevent snakes from entering your property, remove the things snakes are seeking: food and shelter. Snakes find food (rodents) in wood or grass piles, gopher holes and uncovered trashcans. Snakes seek out their own shelter in dark and shady areas such as large rocks, boxes, firewood, and tall ground cover. Residents whose homes are directly adjacent to open space may consider installing a "snake fence" around the perimeter of their property.
