WESTLAKE VILLAGE IS THE PLACE TO BE ON JULY 4th!

50th Annual 4th of July Parade

Residents of all ages are invited to participate in the 50th Annual Westlake Village 4th of July Parade. A full morning of activities begins with a pancake breakfast located at the former hospital property, 4415 Lakeview Canyon at 8:00 am. Breakfast tickets are available for \$5 per person or \$20 per family on the day of the event. The parade will begin at the same location at 9:45 am. The parade follows a short four-block route to Berniece Bennett Park.

To celebrate 50 years, the City invites residents to come to the parade dressed as their favorite decade 1969, 1979, 1989, 1999, or 2009 or in their most patriotic gear. The costume contests

will be judged at 9:15 am in the parade line-up area. Decorate a bike, scooter, stroller or wagon in patriotic themes or simply line the parade route and cheer on the participants. Dogs are encouraged to participate provided they are on a leash. We even have a costume contest category for your patriotic pooches. All veterans are encouraged to join in the parade.

Don't miss the City's number one special event! The 4th of July fireworks will be launched from the Westlake Village Golf Course and reach altitudes of 500 feet. The driving range at the Westlake Village Golf Course will be open to the public at 5:00 pm with free seating, food trucks, games and entertainment that will all lead up to the incredible fireworks show at 9:10 pm. Residents may bring a picnic or purchase food or alcohol from food vendors. Per the California ABC, no outside alcohol is allowed onto the Golf Course property and bags and coolers will be searched before entry.

Residents may also pack a picnic and view the fireworks from Calvary Community Church or Berniece Bennett Park. For safety reasons, please stay off the Golf Course property. The parking lot at the Golf Course is only available for drop offs, however additional parking is available at alternative locations such as the former hospital property. PUBLIC SAFETY CORNER

PET SAFETY TIPS



With the weather starting to warm up and residents spending more times outdoors, the City would like to remind you of some important safety tips regarding your pets. These tips are for both the safety of the pet as well as residents who may need to interact with an escaped pet or wildlife.

ID Microchipping can be an easy and quick way to help locate lost pets. Many pet owners do not realize that they need to register their microchip and provide information to help reconnect with their pet. Information should be updated each time you move, change phone number or in some cases e-mail addresses. Pet licenses are required in the City for both dogs and cats, you may get your pet licensed at the LA County Animal Control Agoura Shelter. Cat and dog owners may also consider a tracking GPS device collar to help locate pets easily.

GATES/DOORS When pets are present make sure to keep them away from any open gates or doors to the outside and encourage your family members to keep gates and doors closed. With the cool breezes as of late, many people are leaving windows open at night and during the day. To help air out your home and keep your pets safe, it is recommended the windows be open only a little bit and not left open when residents are not home.

VEHICLES Never leave your pets unattended inside a parked car, even with the windows rolled down. This is against state law and can result in legal action or broken windows as someone may try to rescue your pet. Please remember that cars heat up quickly, even on cool days this can pose a serious danger to pets, children and the elderly.

POOL SAFETY Similar to never leaving children unattended in a pool area, the same guidelines apply to your pets. It is recommended for family water safety that gates be installed and that locks be high up where they cannot be reached by children or pets.

WALKS We have so many beautiful trails and walking paths in the City, but walkers must be aware of their surroundings. Sidewalks and streets heat up during the summer months. As a good rule of thumb, if it's too hot for the palm of your hand, it is too hot for dog paws. If you walk your dog at night, make yourself visible by wearing light colored clothing and use a light reflecting leash, harness or collar on your pet. Although we know you love your pets, not everyone else walking is interested in seeing them. Please keep dogs on leash when on hiking trails, parks, greenbelts and walks. For the safety of everyone involved always ask permission before petting any animal.

PESTICIDES/TOXINS There are many plants, household cleaners and foods that may be harmful to your pet and other wildlife. For the most up to date list contact your local animal poison hotline or the ASPCA.

CLEAN- UP Please carry dog waste bags or use the multiple bag-dispenser stations around the City to assist you in the picking up of your pet's waste. Please dispose of it properly to keep our city and waterways clean and beautiful.

BUS PASS SALES BEGIN ON JULY 22

Residents will once again have the option to avoid traffic delays associated with drop-off/pick-up at White Oak Elementary, Lindero Canyon Middle and Agoura High Schools by utilizing the Westlake Village Transit service. This City-subsidized program offers stops in all major neighborhoods and the three public schools that serve Westlake Village residents.



An annual round-trip bus pass can be purchased for \$238 and a one-way (morning or afternoon) pass for \$158. Bus passes can be purchased beginning on July 22 in one of three ways: (1) on-line via the City website and the pass will be mailed to your home; (2) mail-in forms can be downloaded from the City's website (mail-in ends on August 16); or (3) in person at City Hall. Residents may also ride one-way without a bus pass for \$2.00. The first day of school is Wednesday, August 21, 2019. Additional information including bus routes, registration forms and sign-ups for bus alert notifications can be found on the City website, www.wlv.org/wvtransit.

This opportunity relates to the North Business Park Specific Plan (NBPSP), which is an effort to guide the inevitable redevelopment of the aging business park area on the north side of the 101 Freeway, west of Lindero Canyon Road. As part of the community outreach and engagement process, the City's project team is convening a Community Advisory Committee (CAC) of up to a dozen community members to advise the team on the plan. The CAC's responsibilities will be to connect with other community members/neighbors to help inform the process; amplify both decisions and concerns along the way, and to advise on what NBPSP alternatives are best for Westlake Village.
