

SUCCESSFUL SENIOR GENIUS CLUB TO RETURN TO ASSIST COMMUNITY MEMBERS WITH TECH HELP

SENIOR GENIUS CLUB

The Senior Genius Club, held at Agoura High School's Media Center will be resuming service in the fall three days per month. The program was originally developed to assist senior community members with technological help. It also provides

community service hours for the teens that volunteer and run the program, and creates an opportunity to increase intergenerational communication. Community members of all ages can participate for tech assistance. The program will be offered the first, second and third Tuesday of the month at Agoura High School from 3:30-5:30 pm. This year's program will begin on October 1 and run through April 21, 2020. Attendees may follow the street signs for the closest parking areas and will be greeted by the student participants. Once attendees arrive at the media center, they will sign in and be assigned to a teen that has expertise in a certain tech area. The tasks can be as simple as posting on Facebook, creating an account, updating malware or browsers, establishing a password system, using their phones, tablets or laptops and much more.



The original program began in late 2016 offering two days a month through a sponsorship from the City of Westlake Village. This year, the City has continued a partnership with the City of Agoura Hills to open the program to residents in both cities. The program is free and appointments are open on a first-come, first-served basis. Each student is able to help during a 30-minute appointment before having to move on to additional person. The last appointment time is 5:00 pm. Both cities would like to thank Agoura High School for making the program a success and opening up Agoura's beautiful facility to the community. FREE C.E.R.T. TRAINING TO BE HELD BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 3



The Los Angeles County Fire Department offers free Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) to residents several times a year. The 7-week class provides training in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations. The upcoming fall CERT class modules will begin on September 3rd in Agoura

Hills. The classes will meet from 6:30 pm to 9:00 pm in the Agoura Hills Civic Center Community Room located at 30001 Ladyface Court.

LINDERO WALKWAY AND BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT



The City of Westlake Village is proud to announce the completion of the Lindero Linear Park! Conceptual design of the project date back to 2011. The City Council authorized staff to construct the project in July 2018, construction began in September 2018, and over the past year the area has been transformed to a beautiful new walking path that connects Agoura Road to Foxfield Drive.

The walkway is lined with trees and vines and provides multiple seat walls that allow our community to rest and take in the beauty of our City, and most importantly provides a safe and accessible walkway for our residents.

Funding for the project was provided by Metro, a partner in our Community. Metro is a transportation planner, funder, builder and operator for the country's most populous county. The Agency provides resources to improve quality of life in LA County by partnering with communities to fund local projects.

Together with their agency, the City is planning a project opening and ribbon cutting ceremony for September 25th at 4pm. Come by bike or walk down from your home. We hope to see you there!

CITY SOLICITATION REQUIREMENTS



With warmer weather and longer daylight, residents should be reminded that the Westlake Village Municipal Code 6.3.010 prohibits soliciting between the hours of 5:00 pm and 9:00 am, except during the period of daylight-saving time when soliciting is prohibited from during the hours of 7:00 pm and 9:00 am.

Solicitors in the City are required to have an information card issued by the Los Angeles County. Residents should ask solicitors to display their information card and to identify how the charitable funds requested will be used. Additionally, residents are encouraged to contact the Lost Hills Sheriff's Station, 818-878-1808, to report any suspicious solicitation activity.
