SENIOR OPPORTUNITIES IN WESTLAKE VILLAGE



The City offers a variety of programs specifically designed for its senior residents. These programs include five sessions of the senior adult recreation program, Dial-A-Ride transportation service, Community Tech Help Club and special lectures provided by Senior Concerns.

Senior Recreation

The popular Westlake Village Senior Recreation Program currently offers 13 classes including Yoga Basics, Gentle Yoga Basics, Zumba Gold, T'ai

Chi, Bridge Class, Tai Chi Kung Fu Fan and a new Art Trek class. These classes are offered in cooperation with the Conejo Recreation and Park District. City residents over the age of 55 can register for \$10 per class session (3, 4, or 8-week sessions). All classes are held at the Westlake Village Civic Center. Community Tech Help Club

Need help with your electronics? Take advantage of the Community Tech Help Club! Twice a month tech-savvy students at Agoura High School provide a free service to answer all your electronic questions! Held in the Agoura H.S. Media Center from 3:30 to 5:30 pm at 28545 W. Driver Ave, Agoura Hills, CA 91301. Follow the parking lot signs. The parking area and media room are wheelchair and walker-accessible, however, there is a short walk to get to the center. Senior and Disabled Dial-A-Ride

Dial-A-Ride is a service for residents over the age of 65 or those with a disability that prevents them from driving. Rides are available throughout the Cities of Westlake Village, Oak Park, Agoura Hills and Thousand Oaks. Eligible residents need to obtain a free Dial-A-Ride card from City Hall. The City offers the program through a contract with the City of Thousand Oaks with service 7 days a week. BENEFITS OF WEEKLY STREET SWEEPING

The City of Westlake Village takes great pride in the community's well-maintained streets and public landscaped areas. The City contracts for street sweeping service on a weekly basis. In addition, the weekly sweeping helps to prevent unwanted materials from entering the storm drains, creeks and the lake. The City's street sweeping occurs on Thursdays and Fridays each week.

As the fall weather arrives and leaves begin to drop, residents are asked to help maximize street sweeping effectiveness by parking off the roadway on their neighborhood cleaning day.

2020 GRANTS OFFERED

FOR COMMUNITY AND CULTURAL ORGANIZATIONS

The City is now accepting applications for the 2020 Community Service Grant Program. The City recognizes the value of local organizations that provide specialized social services and cultural programs benefitting our citizens. Every group will be considered, but not all groups may receive funding. Grants will be awarded in amounts of not less than \$250. The application process for the 2020 year will begin on November 1, 2019 and is due by 5:00 pm on Friday, January 24, 2020.

ANNUAL STREET IMPROVEMENTS

The City has contracted with All American Asphalt for our Annual Street Improvement Project. This year we will focus on Agoura Road and Lindero Canyon Blvd. We are proud of how well maintained our streets are, and hope you are too. This year nearly a third of the project will be funded by SB-1 State funding in combination with Measure M, and Measure R Los Angeles County funding. Construction may begin as early as mid-November. WATER DISTRICT UPGRADES PLANNED FOR 2020

Utility and street work is currently being planned by the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District along Lindero Canyon Road from Thousand Oaks to the Northmost City Limit. The City would like to invite you to join us for a project presentation by LVMWD at the Westlake Village Civic Center on November 19 at 6pm. A contract has not yet been awarded for the work. The City would like to hear your input before going out to Bid. The project will have significant traffic impacts along Lindero Canyon Road and Thousand Oaks Boulevard during construction, we're hoping you'll engage with Las Virgenes Municipal Water District at this meeting and help the team understand how best to spread the word once construction begins in Spring or Summer 2020.
