North Business Park Specific Plan UPDATE & OPEN HOUSE

The North Business Park Specific Plan continues to move closer to consideration by the City Council. The plan, if adopted, will set the City's policy, a roadmap of sorts, for the future design, development and use of properties within the Business Park areas north of the 101 freeway. At the highest level, the plan serves as a bridge between the vision of the founders of Westlake Village and the future; aiming to guide development of private properties, address public facility and infrastructure improvement, and include the future development of things such as sidewalks and public open spaces in the area.



The North Business Park Specific Plan Community Advisory Committee recently completed five outreach and engagement meetings to help advise the plan team on the document. Significant revisions have been made to the plan based on these meetings, feedback received from the community, and new State laws.

A second Open House will be held for the North Business Park Specific Plan on February 20 from 6:00 p.m.- 8:00 p.m. at the Civic Center's large community room. This Open House is intended to update the community on the major revisions to the Plan over the past year, the various components of the plan, and to solicit feedback. Following this, the plan team will work to incorporate any necessary revisions into the final draft document with an anticipated public review version available in early March. Staff anticipates having the plan before the City Council for a public hearing on March 25, 2020.
