
Summer Camps Coming Soon...

Status of CITY PARKS

Following L.A. County Public Health Orders, the City of Westlake Village has opened some of its parks for limited use only. The following parks are open only for walking, jogging, or running with adherence to physical distancing guidelines.

- ⇄ (Skate Park Closed)

All park facilities including playgrounds, restrooms, drinking fountains, basketball courts, and picnic areas are closed until further notice. Group gatherings and organized sports will not be allowed until further notice. Park users are to wear cloth face coverings per the CDC and L.A. County guidelines.

The Westlake Village Community Park reopened on June 1, 2020 for reduced hours from 6:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m.

The Westlake Village Skate Park and Dog Park will remain closed until further notice.



WESTLAKE VILLAGE CITY PARKS

EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2020

Westlake Village park users are required to continue social distancing by keeping physical distances of a minimum of 6 feet, not congregating as a group at City parks, and wearing cloth face coverings per the CDC guidelines.



RATTLESNAKE SEASON

Due to Westlake Village's proximity to open space, many neighborhoods and businesses often encounter wildlife of all kinds. With summer around the corner, rattlesnakes are beginning to make an appearance. If you encounter a rattlesnake, contact the Fire Department immediately by calling 911. Firefighters will respond and remove them. Please maintain a safe distance while keeping an eye on its whereabouts to assist firefighters in locating the snake.

To help prevent snakes from entering your property, remove the things snakes are seeking: food and shelter. Snakes find food (rodents) in wood or grass piles, gopher holes, and uncovered trashcans. Snakes also seek out their own shelter in dark and shady areas such as large rocks, boxes, firewood, and tall ground cover. Residents whose homes are directly adjacent to open space may consider installing a "snake fence" around the perimeter of their property.
