




I Have a Dream **Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.**

On August 28, 1963, on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial during the March on Washington, Martin Luther King gave one of the most powerful and memorable speeches in our nation's history. His words, paired with Caldecott Honor winner Kadir Nelson's magnificent paintings, make for a picture book certain to be treasured by children and adults alike. *(Children's Picture Book)*



Behind the Dream by Clarence B. Jones

"I have a dream." When those words were spoken on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial on August 28, 1963, the crowd stood, electrified, as Martin Luther King, Jr. brought the plight of African Americans to the public consciousness and firmly established himself as one of the greatest orators of all time. Behind the Dream is a thrilling, behind-the-scenes account of the weeks leading up to the great event, as told by Clarence Jones, co-writer of the speech and close confidant to King. *(Adult Nonfiction)*

No issue in 1960s America was more vital than civil rights, and no two public figures were more crucial in the drama of race relations in this era than Martin Luther King, Jr., and Robert F. Kennedy. New Waste Management Bins Available

In accordance with state mandate SB 1383, California residents whose waste container is damaged can now call and receive a new waste container, standardized for each waste stream. The base color of the new Waste Management containers is grey. The lids come in different colors: black lid for trash, blue lid for recycling, and green lid for organics. Sustainability is a top priority for Waste Management. The new carts are made from materials containing 10% bulky rigid recycled plastics and up to 35% post-consumer recycled content.
