





Hearing Date for the

Proposed Retail Center on Russell Ranch Road (Planning Area C)

## Tentatively Scheduled for April 25




Over the past year, the City has been reviewing an application filed by the Selleck Development Group for a proposed development on "Planning Area C" located on Russell Ranch Road. The proposed project includes a Target store and accompanying retail center. During this time, the City Council's Planning Area C Ad-hoc Committee and staff have been addressing the various issues associated with this complex project. The review and analysis of this project are nearing completion and a hearing date has been tentatively set for the City Council meeting of April 25.

The culmination of the 9-month process of documenting the potential environmental impacts of the project concluded on March 22 with the closure of the 45-day public review period of the Environmental Impact Report (EIR). The City's Environmental consultant, Rincon Consultants is currently responding to the comments that were received by the City on the EIR. Once these responses are complete, a Final Hearing Draft EIR will be prepared which will allow the matter to proceed to Public Hearing.

While the design of the project has evolved over the past year, there are still a number of outstanding design issues that are currently being reviewed by City staff, the Ad-hoc Committee, and the independent architectural consultant retained by the City, Francisco Behr. Assuming that most, if not all, of these issues are addressed, a public hearing on this project is expected to be held at the April 25 City Council meeting which begins at 6:30 pm. All residents and interested parties are encouraged to attend this meeting and provide testimony to the City Council on this matter.

Application materials and plans are available for public review at City Hall and on the City's website at [www.wlv.org](http://www.wlv.org). Testimony on the project can be made in writing to the Planning Department, or in person at the public hearing. # SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM

## 25 YEARS OF PROGRAMMING

The City will once again be offering a comprehensive Summer Recreation Program for young residents. Now in its twenty-fifth year, the program features cost effective summer recreation activities for children ages 5-15. The fun kicks off on June 18 and runs through August 10. Residents may sign up for two-day, three-day, weekly, or entire summer camp options including Camp Westlake Village, a morning and afternoon drop-in program, morning enrichment classes, and the very popular Summer Academy program. The Summer Academy will offer 21 week-long specialty camps in areas such as theater, Lego's, and robotics. All of these choices ensure that the City is offering the right program for you or your child.

A 2012 Summer Recreation brochure is currently being printed and will be sent home with students from White Oak and St. Jude's Elementary Schools in April. All Summer Recreation Programs are held at White Oak Elementary School through a contract between the City and the Conejo Recreation and Park District. ## Agoura Road Medians Phase II



Since the City Council's adoption of the Citywide Streetscape Master Plan in 2006, the City has been updating and improving the landscape in the street medians at various locations. In fact, the City has already completed several streetscape projects which include landscape renovation of the Triunfo Canyon Road medians, Agoura Road medians to the west of Lindero Canyon Road, and Lindero Canyon Road medians from Via Colinas to Thousand Oaks Boulevard.

Starting in early May, construction of the second phase of the Agoura Road median project from Lindero Canyon Road to the eastern City limit will begin. As with the previous Agoura Road median project, the second phase of this project will result in a new look to the median by implementing an approved landscaping pallet that is specific to Agoura Road and its surrounding landscape. Each median project has reduced water runoff to Westlake Lake by allowing more irrigation water to percolate into the ground. This is accomplished by redesigning the median landscaping, lowering the median grade, and installing new irrigation systems. The second phase of the Agoura Road project will continue the focus of protecting the existing pine trees along Agoura Road. ## LVMWD Offers Sewer Fee Discounts for Low Water Users

Las Virgenes Municipal Water District (LVMWD) offers a 10 percent credit on sewer fees to customers whose water use falls below minimum, or "first tier" levels during a given two-month billing period.

The credit for low use is automatically applied to LVMWD service bills and it is not necessary to request the adjustment. # Public Safety Corner

## Preparing for Emergencies

One of the first steps in disaster preparedness is the creation of a basic disaster supply kit. The LA County Fire Department recommends that all kits contain the following:

- ★ Water- a minimum of a 3-day supply (one gallon per person per day)
- ★ Food- a minimum of a 3-day supply (food bars, canned goods, meals ready to eat, etc.)
- ★ Flashlight
- ★ Portable radio
- ★ Extra batteries
- ★ First Aid Kit including surgical and other protective gloves
- ★ Emergency blanket(s)
- ★ Multi-purpose utility shut-off tool
- ★ Cash
- ★ Toiletries
- ★ Cotton clothing
- ★ Small toolkit
- ★ Prescription glasses
- ★ Prescription medication - five day supply and prescription
- ★ Coloring books- small activities for children

If you have a pet at home, the following should be included in your disaster supply kit:

- ★ Food, water, and medications - a minimum of a 3 day supply of each
- ★ Dishes - for both food and water
- ★ Can opener - for food
- ★ Sanitation - dog baggies, bagged pet litter with pan and scoop
- ★ Collar, ID tags, and leash
- ★ Crates/carrier
- ★ Important information bag- A photo of your pet- license, microchip, and vaccination information along with copies of prescriptions and medical records in a plastic bag in your kit
- ★ Toys, treats, and bedding
