Annual Street Resurfacing Work

Fiscal Year 2012-13

Several years ago, the City adopted an annual street resurfacing program. Through the program, City streets are inspected each year to determine which streets, if any, require maintenance. This ensures that those streets with the highest priority are maintained each year.

The City's annual street resurfacing program for the 2012-13 Fiscal Year will consist of a slurry application on Lindero Canyon Road in two locations. The initial work will begin from the northern City limit to Thousand Oaks Boulevard with the second slurry occurring between Triunfo Canyon Road and "The Cove" neighborhood. In addition, work will also be performed within the City's business park district on La Baya Drive, Via Colinas, and Cedar Valley Drive.

Traffic control devices will be in place during the project and it is anticipated that a travel lane in each direction will remain open at all times. Residents are reminded to drive with caution while traveling in this area. Did You Know? Encroachment Permits

Did you know that any work in the public right-of-way (street/sidewalk) requires an Encroachment Permit from the City? Previously these permits were processed on behalf of the City by Los Angeles County requiring applicants to obtain permits from the County's Westchester office. The City recently took over this process and began issuing encroachment permits at City Hall. The most typical residential types of encroachment permits are for storage bins, dumpsters, and the storage of supplies in the public right-of-way. Encroachment permits are also required for any work on residential property that may impact the adjacent sidewalk or street including a new driveway or landscaping overhaul. 

Senior Recreation

Parent volunteers play the role of immigration officers and begin processing these newly arrived immigrants at "Ellis Island." This hands-on educational program continues through the day as students go beyond learning history and get a chance to live history. The Ellis Island experience is a highlight for all White Oak third graders as it gives the students a realistic glimpse back in time.


