

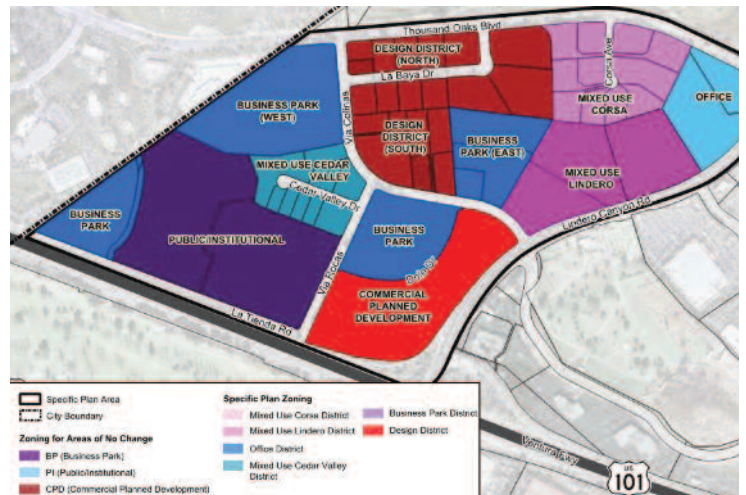
North Business Park

Specific Plan Study Session & Public Hearing Scheduled

Following more than ten years of study and outreach by City staff and consultants, the North Business Park Specific Plan is set for consideration by the City Council. A City Council Study Session will be held on March 11, 2020 with a formal public hearing set for March 25, 2020.

Westlake Village began as a master planned community, establishing where development should go, what it should look like, and the types of public amenities to be included. The North Business Park Specific Plan carries into the future the City's founding values of maintaining local control, quality aesthetics, high levels of community services, and public safety.

Conceived as a long-range plan, the North Business Park Specific Plan is intended to span up to 25 years and avoid state imposed mandates that would eliminate local control. The Plan aims to improve traffic flow throughout the area, respond to and prepare for changing economic conditions, and allow for the creation of new revenue streams to maintain and improve City services. The Plan would accomplish this by reducing the office and commercial footprint in the area by



nearly 400,000 square feet and allowing for up to 607 new units within a high-quality residential development. The resulting developments will better serve a wider breadth of the population ranging from youth to seniors, and a diverse workforce such as healthcare workers, schoolteachers, firefighters, and more.

Swimming Pool Discharge

Swimming pools and hot tubs contain chemicals and other pollutants that could be harmful to the environment if not disposed of and/or treated properly. As we prepare our pools for a summer full of fun, it is important to keep a few things in mind:

1. Prior to draining the pool for cleaning, water must be dechlorinated and/or dibrominated through the use of holding time, aeration, and/or sodium thiosulfate. Chlorine residual in the discharge shall not exceed 0.1 mg/L.
2. Pool discharges must be within a pH range of 6.5 to 8.5 standard units.
3. As discharged water flows over the ground, the flow path from the point of discharge to the point of entry into the storm drain system must be clear of debris and other pollutants.
4. Discharges allowed from pools and spas do not include backwash or water containing bacteria, detergents, wastes, algicides, or any other chemicals including salts from pools commonly referred to as "saltwater pools" in excess of applicable water quality objectives.
5. Discharge water containing copper based algicides is not permitted.
6. It is encouraged that discharges are volumetrically and velocity controlled to promote evaporation and/or infiltration.
7. Pools over 100,000 gallons will require special permission and additional control measures.

Remember, all discharges to storm drains enter local creeks and lakes untreated. You can do your part to ensure a healthy and safe environment. Your pool maintenance professional may be able to assist you with the process or you may also contact the City's Stormwater Program Manager with any questions at 818-383-3092.

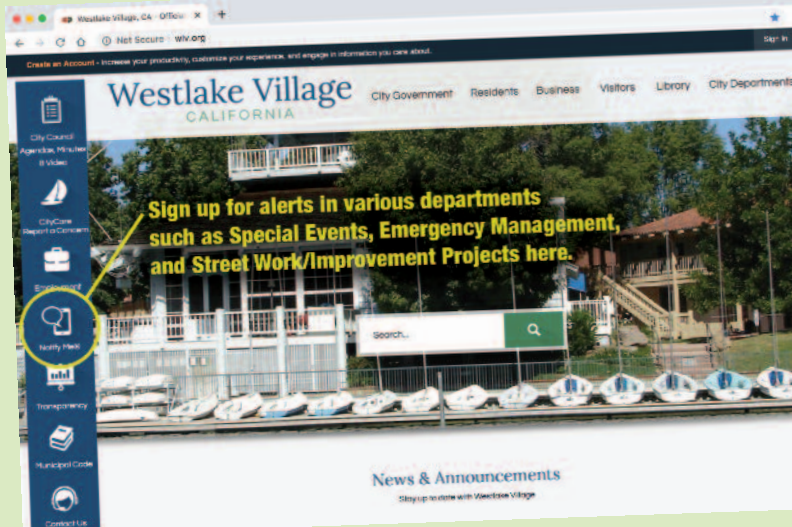
Reminder: Community Tech Help still available!

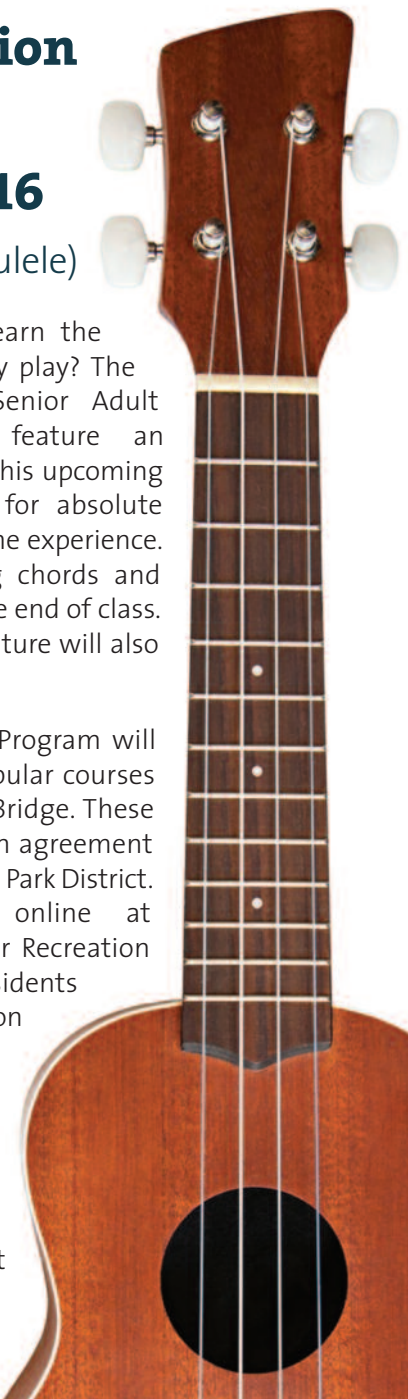


Senior Recreation Spring Session Begins March 16

2020 Census Information

Responding to the census is important. The 2020 Census will influence funding for community services for the next 10 years. Data from the census helps determine where more than \$675 billion is spent each year in states and communities. That includes money for things like:

- › Housing and food assistance
- › Libraries and community centers
- › First responders, like firefighters
- › Medicare and Medicaid
- › Hospitals
- › Schools

Responding is easy. Beginning in mid-March 2020, people will be able to respond to the census online, by phone, or by mail. They can choose the option that works best for them. Responding is safe. Personal information provided on the census is kept confidential by law. An individual's responses can only be used to produce statistics. They cannot be shared with law enforcement agencies or used against people by any government agency or court in any way. For more information, visit: 2020CENSUS.GOV.
