





### **Empire of Wild** by Cherie Dimaline

A bold and brilliant new indigenous voice in contemporary literature makes her American debut with this kinetic, imaginative, and sensuous fable inspired by the traditional Canadian Métis legend of the Rogarou--a werewolf-like creature that haunts the roads and woods of native people's communities.

Joan has been searching for her missing husband, Victor, for nearly a year--ever since that terrible night he mysteriously vanished. *(Adult Fiction)*



### **Crooked Hallelujah** by Kelli Jo Ford

Crooked Hallelujah tells the stories of Justine--a mixed-blood Cherokee woman-- and her daughter, Reney, as they move from Eastern Oklahoma's Indian Country in the hopes of starting a new, more stable life in Texas amid the oil bust of the 1980s. Kelli Jo Ford depicts what this family of proud, stubborn, Cherokee women sacrifices for

those they love, amid larger forces of history, religion, class, and culture. *(Adult Fiction)*
